Possibly the \$5.00 toll charge on this huge American expenditure is their way of reserving funds for the smaller highways. If so, we're all for it in Ontario. We're tired of truvelling highways which are always halfdone and never completed. The No. 7 situation is repeated everywhere you drive in our province. New for ten miles, middling good for another ten, torn up in one spot, then new for another. It must be even more discouraging to the tourists we lure from the beautiful American roads than it is to us bump-hardened veterans.
