**MORE ABOUT HOUSING IMP. PREXY LETTER**

Preston, Ont., April, 1954

Dear Mr. Editor: Lengthy was Vet Councillor's letter which ended in agreement of rent controls. Councillor will, I am sure, forgive me if I missed some of the council notes, not living in Georgetown. I am mindful of the fact, however, that I do not recall where a councillor approached his division in respect to how he could serve the community, other than giving his advertised willingness to do his best, and to call upon him at all times. The bombshell: "Abolishment of Controls" was this laid before the ratepayer? Did the councillors state to the Legion, and to the ratepayer, that on such a date "We shall remove control of rent?" If they did, then plague to Georgetown.

My letter gave to Georgetown what councillor Allen provided — an explanation of why control was lost. The whole set up, in one letter, "What The Council Did" column cost eight cents, so three parts of Georgetown doesn't read the Herald. That is why I urge the councillors to meet the people.

"In Defence of Landlords," Mrs. Cordaro, several apartments have standards, uphold good tenants, good rents, and do not worry over controls. Their tenants stay, others recently as last August, rent of seven room house, \$21 month, no hot water, no heating (reason flooded cellar). No decoration. Today \$40, no change. Another house cost \$1500. Two apartments, \$100, no hot water, no heating. Tenants heat apartments. Rents raised \$5 per month.

Bolls down to the fact that landlords have hundreds after their rooms, and if they find people who will put up with shambles, they are content. Council can enforce that repairs and adequate housing, sanitation and hygiene be carried out, — that is their job, medical officers of health's job, and you an investor, your job. This completed, there will be no undesirable and a peaceful community. I hope to have the pleasure of answering the P.S. on the next letter.
