**ESQUEQUING COUNCIL**

**ESQUEQUING SEEKS RESTRICTED HUNT**

Acting on a petition from a number of township residents, Reeve Wilfrid Bird and Deputy Reeve Walter Linham will interview the Department of Game and Fisheries to ask for a restricted deer hunt this fall in Esquequing.

There has been no local hunting since the department ruled three years ago that all deer hunts must be open to all Ontario residents. Originally it was intended to make deer hunting wide open, but there was so much opposition from urban townships that the ruling was reversed and a township council was given the authority to ban hunting.

It would be the intention this year to have licences restricted to 80 per cent resident and 20 per cent non-resident, as was the case a few years ago.

Bounty for foxes destroyed was paid to Charles Ferrier, Milton, \$3 and Stephen Stackelberg, Milton, \$7.50. Sheep claims amounted to \$50. Harry R. Brown received \$25 for a sheep killed and Gilbert English \$25 for 2 sheep and a lamb injured. A. N. Stark received \$8 for two trips as valuator.

A \$25 grant was made to Halton Music Festival. Permission was asked of the Highways Department to purchase a motor grader, the road superintendent was instructed to investigate.


