

Acting on a petition from a number of township residents, Reeve Wilfrid Bird and Deputy Reeve Walter Linham will interview the Department of Game and Fisheries to ask for a restricted deer hunt

this fall in Esquesing. There has been no local hunting since the department ruled three years ago that all deer hunts must be open to all Ontario residents. Originally it was intended to make deer hunting wide open,, but therewas so much opposition from urban townships that the ruling was reversed and a township council was given the authority to ban hunting.

It would be the intention this year to have licences restricted to 80 per cent resident and 20 per cent non-resident, as was the case a few


