Rendered Long Service As Town Works Employee

A faithful town employee for 40 years who retired five years ago, Henry Marchmont, 82, was buried in Greenwood Cemetery yesterday following a funeral service conducted by Rev. Alex. J. Calder at the McClure Funeral Home. He was the son of the late William Marchmont and Margaret North. He died Sunday in Brampton hospital where was taken after suffering a fall at his home.

Native of Churchville, and a Glen Williams resident after his family moved there when he was a young man, Mr. Marchmont was one of Georgetown's most familiar figures since the days when one of his duties was to ring the town bell. The old bell, silent for years, was rung by him for the last time on Coronation Day last year and soon after was taken down from the belfry in the Old Town Hall, to be placed in front of the fire hall as a souvenir of the old days.

After his marriage to Bertha Young, who died in 1950, they lived for a time in Streetsville, then returned to Georgetown where he worked for a time at the old "lower mill" and as a driver for Ballantine's coal wagon before taking a position with the town.

Surviving are seven children, 29 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren. Members of the family are Mrs. Ken Hunter (Margaret) and Mrs. John Oliver (Pearl) of Georgetown; Wesley and Mrs. F. Hunter (Irene) of Acton; Earl of Glen Williams; Mrs. D. Anderson (Queenie) of London; and Mrs. C. W. McDonald (Vera) of Brampton. Another daughter Mrs. Andrew Hunter, predeceased her father. Also surviving are two sisters and a brother, Mrs. Tom Roberts and Mrs. William Cook, Guelph, and Richard Marchmont, Toronto.
