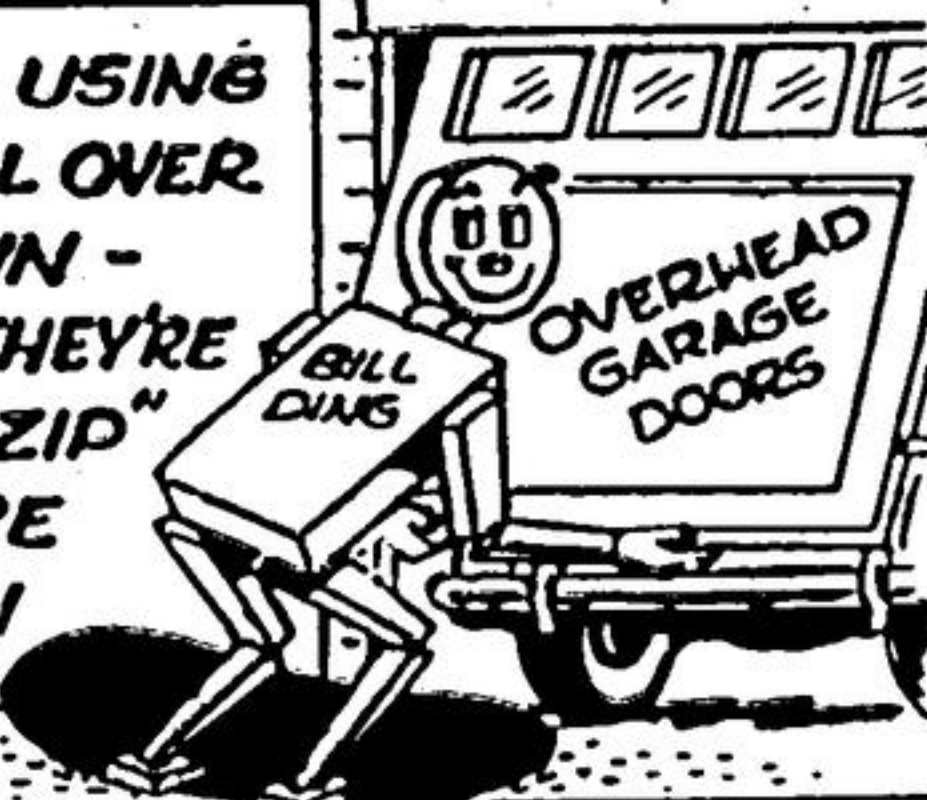

New Principal at Glen Other Teachers Move

Four teacher changes, including a new principal at Glen Williams, have been made in schools administered by the board of Educating School Area 1.

Replacing Ralph Wilson, who is going back to the Niagara district after two years as principal at the Glen will be Margaret Roedel, a Georgetown girl who has been teaching in Sunnyside School, Etobicoke, and before that was on the Norval staff. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Comfort Roedel, Draper Street. The other three staff members will be returning, Mrs. Edna Beaumont, Mrs. Nellie Gardiner and Mrs. Elsie Garner.

At Norval where Douglas Copeland is principal and Mrs. J. T. Casseaden and Miss Jane Nakamura on staff, the latter has resigned to take a position in another township school. Her replacement will be Miss Ora Carson, Guelph, who is graduating from Hamilton Normal School.

The Stewarttown teacher, Mrs. Emily Woods will teach at a school in her home district of Belwood next fall. Succeeding her at Stewarttown is Mrs. Lyla Pollock, who came here from western Canada and has been on the teaching staff of Cedarvale School for Girls.

A Horriby teacher, Bruce Stevenson of Hamilton, will take over the position at Dufferin vacated by Mrs. Florence Harris.

The new 3-room Norval school has been in operation this year and at Glen Williams it is hoped to have the new addition ready for opening early in the fall. A 2-room addition is being added to the present building, and temporarily one classroom is housed in the Glen town hall.
