AT ESQUESING COUNCIL.

Limitations in use of cabin trailers in Esquimes Township was an important item of business at last week's council meeting. A by-law received approval at the meeting which is published elsewhere in this edition of the Herald.

A \$1,000 grant to the Federation of Agriculture will be made by the council, and the money granted when a by-law is passed at a later meeting.

A motion to rescind an earlier by-law, by which a two fifth of a mill levy has been added on each tax bill, carried. A recorded vote was asked by Cr. George Currie who, with Cr. Campbell Sinclair opposed the motion. Reeve Bird, Deputy Jeeve Linham and Cr. Spencer Willson favoured the \$1,000 grant.

A council member, Campbell Sinclair was appointed representative on the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

Bounty of \$1.50 each for 10 pups and \$3.00 each for 3 foxes destroyed was paid to: Thomas Allan, Georgetown \$3; Alois Lindinger, Georgetown \$6; Wm. Bennett, Georgetown \$3; Wm. Carhart, Georgetown, \$1.50; Joe Schertel, Norval, \$1.50; Charles Ricci, Milton \$1.50; George Brown, Milton, \$4.50; Bruce Storey, Acton, \$3.

Meeting as a court of revision before the regular meeting changes in the 1954 tax rolls were made as follows: James McMaster, \$150 written off, as he is not assessable; \$321 written off property recently acquired by School Area No. 1 which is exempt from taxation; business tax of \$21.31 for 1952 for Fred Leeder written off.

The clerk was authorized to sell the old council chamber chairs at \$2.00 each. Road accounts totalled \$6,212. \$7,700, half the year's high school levy, was paid to North Halton school board. At a special meeting Thursday, council decided to petition county council to take over the Chinguacousy Esquimes boundary as a county road. It comprises lots 5 and 10 on the eleventh concession.
