**Last Member of A Pioneer Family**

First old time fiddler to win a prize at the CNE, and member of one of Esqueving's oldest families, John Wilmer Nickell, 86, died yesterday in Guelph General Hospital.

Son of James Nickell and Sarah Woods he lived near Limehouse until eight years ago since when he made his home at Eden Mills with his daughter. He was a descendant of William Nickell who came from Ireland in 1812 to be the township's third settler, taking up land at Dolly Varden which was in the family name until last year.

Known far and wide for his ability as a fiddler, Mr. Nickell served as the secretary treasurer of S.S. No. 16, and of Limehouse School and the Limehouse Presbyterian Church. He was interested in horses and sold six horses for the South African war at the turn of the century.

Predeceased in 1948 by his wife, he leaves two children, Mrs. Stanley Wilson, Eden Mills and James A. Nickell, Pontiac, Michigan, three grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Three children died in infancy, Edna, Gordon, and Reggie. Six brother and sisters predeceased him, Mrs. Agnes Bell, Timmins; Mrs. Minnie Graham, Winnipeg; Mrs. Edith Weatherall, Toronto; Dr. Robert, Georgetown; William, Sarnia; and his twin brother, James, Limehouse.
