WHAT COUNCIL DID

May Use Bulclam Here For Garbage Disposal

Possibility that Georgetown will adopt the "Bulclam" method of garbage disposal was hinted strongly at Monday's council meeting, although no definite action has yet been taken.

A Bulclam machine, demonstrated recently in town, has been purchased by the neighbouring town of Brampton. By this method, garbage is pressed flat, and covered with earth in one operation and the land reclaimed for parks or recreation purposes. It would be the town's plan to use it the first year on waste land around the sewage disposal plant, and show taxpayers how successfully this can be done, large branching into more populated portions of town.

Before any final decision is made, other garbage disposal methods will be considered, including a proposition from Bob Lane to fill land owned by him for the next five years.

Cr. Sargent drew council's attention to the need of ridding the present dump of rats when it is abandoned.

Third reading was given to a by-law for issuing \$63,500 in debentures for the 4-room addition to Wrigglesworth School.

Downtown parking locations were discussed briefly. A suggestion to have public parking behind the McGibbon Hotel with the town waiving taxes on property used was left with the road committee for investigation.

A \$50 town grant was made to the juvenile baseball club.

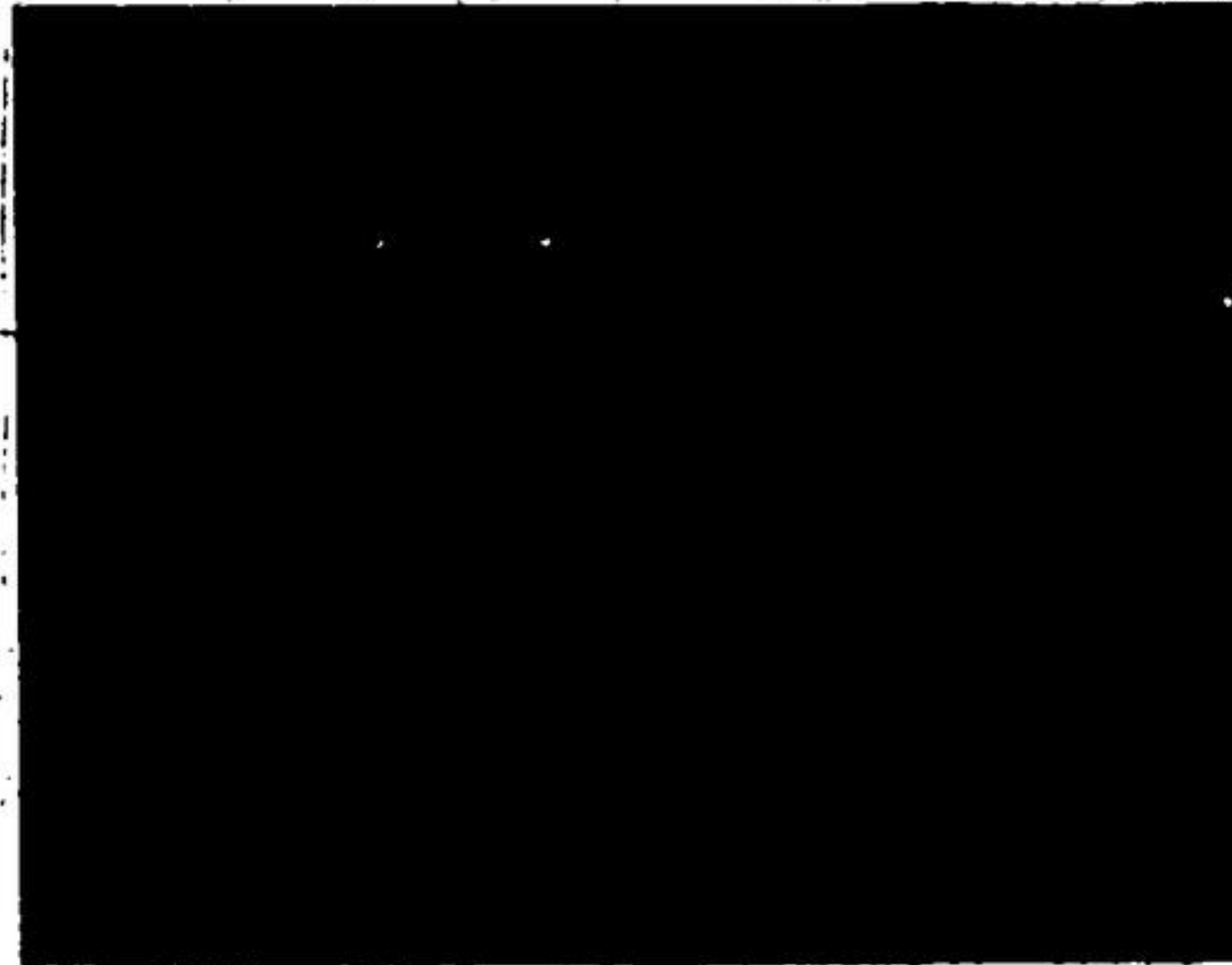

Local People Plan to Attend Witness Rally

A number of local delegates will attend a five-day assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses to be held at the Exhibition Grounds, Toronto on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday this week.

The convention is under the sponsorship of the Watch Tower & Bible Tract Society and will include congregations from Ontario and Quebec and the neighbouring United States. The convention is primarily for bible instruction and concentrated gospel preaching in and around metropolitan Toronto.

All five days of the assembly will consist of morning, afternoon and evening sessions of bible talks, discussions and demonstrations which are open to the public without charge.

FARM NEWS

Overfat Hogs are Economic Waste

Overfat hogs are an economic waste, stated R. K. Bennett, Chief Livestock Marketing, Canada Department of Agriculture, when addressing the Ontario's Agricultural Representatives in conference at the Kemptville Agricultural School the week of July 5th.

With Grade X hogs at \$43.50 per cwt. and B's a dollar less, the fat which has to be trimmed off - the bottom half of the B's and the C's is not worth over 7 cents per pound. One hundred pounds of pork fat makes roughly 65 lbs. of lard - so we have no hesitation in agreeing with Mr. Bennett that overfatted hogs constitute not only an economic waste, but a threat to the future of Canada's hog industry. Just why Ontario and Canadian Swine producers are not prepared to do something to save their own industry we find it difficult to understand. If Halton and Ontario hog producers would do nothing more than market their hogs at the proper weight, they would increase the percentage of A hogs being marketed from less than 30 per cent to at least 60 per cent.

The market in U.S. for some of our choice cuts - loins, back-bacon and hams - has been a real factor in maintaining a profitable hog industry. Apparently the average hog producer puts more confidence in the Ontario Hog Marketing Scheme than in producing a quality product.

Marketing schemes have a real place in our economy but no Marketing Scheme can save an industry if the product is produced in excess of our domestic requirements and if as a result of a poor quality
