#### May Use Bulklam Here For Garbage Disposal

Possibility that Georgetown will adopt the "Bullclam" method of garbage disposal was hinted strongly at Monday's council meeting, although no definite action has yet

A Bullclam machine, demonstrated recently in town, has been purchased by the neighbouring town of Brampton. By this method, garbage is pressed flat, and covered with earth in one operation and the land reclaimed for parks or recreation purposes. It would be the town's plan to, use it the first year on waste land around the sewage disposal plant, and show taxpayers how successfully this can be done, later branching into more popula-

ted portions of town. Before any final decision is made, other garbage dispusal methods will be considered, including a proposttion from Bob Lane to fill land owned by him for the next five

FARM NEWS

#### Overfat Hogs are Economic Waste

Overfat hogs are an economic waste, stated R K Bennett, Chief Livestock Marketing, Canada Department of Agriculture, when addressing the Ontarlo's Agricultural Representatives in conference at the Kemptythe Agricultural School the week of July 5th.

With Grade A hogs at \$43.50 per ewt and H I's a dollar less, the fat which has to be trunmed off - tho bottom half of the H. I's and the C's is not worth over 7 cents per pound. One hundred pounds of pork fat makes roughly 65 ths. of lard - so no have in histalion in agreeing with Mr. Bennett that overtmished logs constitute not only an econointe waste, but a threat to the future of Canada's hog industry. Just why Ontarto and Canadian Swine producers are not prepared to do something to save their own industry we find it difficult to understand. If Halton and Ontario hog producers would do nothing' more than market their hogs at the proper weight, they would increase the percentage of A hogs being marketed from less than 30 per cent to at least 60 per cent.

The market in U.S. for some of our choicer cuts - loins, back bacon and hams -- has been a real factor in maintaining a profitable hog industry. Apparently the average hog producer puts more con-"fidence in the Ontario Hog Marketdny Scheme than in producing a -quality-product. - .

Marketing schemes have a real place in our economy but no Marketing Scheme can save an industry if the product is produced in exoses of our domestic requirements and if as a result of a poor bealty
