The funeral service was held in Duff's Presbyterian Church on July 26th, with interment in Crown Cemetery, Pushtun.

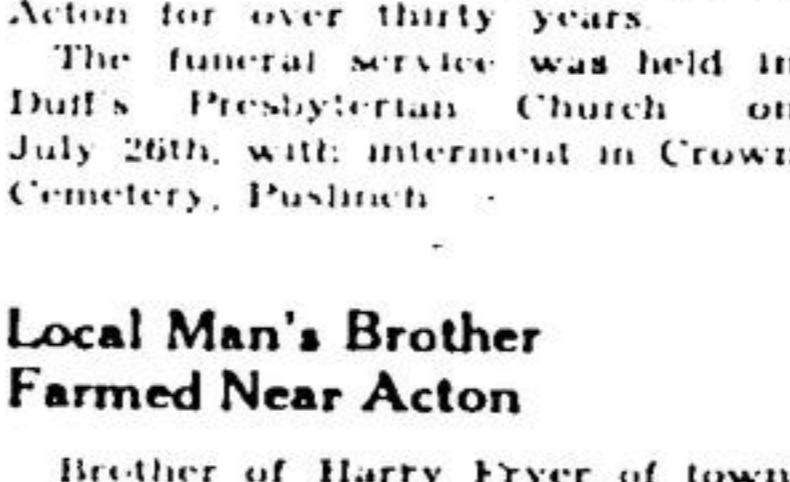
**Local Man's Brother
