erous cases of tuberculosis in mild or inactive forms were discovered which require constant medical follow-up.

Mrs. M. E. Lunau, executive secretary of the Association says that the regular monthly clinic for the Georgetown district is held at the Guelph Hospital. Dr. Joseph Lee of the Mount St. Joseph Sanatorium is in charge of the clinics.

Mrs. Lunau explains that the actual discovery of tuberculosis or traces of the disease made at the clinics represents only a portion of those actually detected each month. She says "we of course rely heavily upon the family doctor who discovers symptoms or traces of tuberculosis in his own office and refers them to our clinics. We do not take these cases into consideration when compiling the attendance findings of our clinics."

CHEST X-RAY CLINICS REVEAL TB SYMPTOMS

Of nearly 300 x-rays taken at free chest clinics throughout Halton County during the first six months of this year, one active case of tuberculosis was discovered requiring sanatorium treatment. An official of the Halton County TB Association says, however, that "numer-
