
Tells Brampton Industries To Farmer Club Meeting



Four advisory boards have been set up to deal with problems which arise in the main phases of conservation work. Alex Maclaren, Georgetown heads the farm planning and land use board. W. M. Robinson, Brampton, is in charge of public relations. R. R. Parker is flood control chairman. W. M. Curry, Orangeville is in charge of reforesation.




