



Althtough he's had his pants nicked on more than a few occasions Belton still operates with a devilmay-care attitude. He's also become a student of car racing and this year journeyed to Indianapolis for the 500-mile classic and a look at the famous 16th Street track.

"The 16th Street track is similar to Pinecrest in its general layout" Belton stated, "except that it is some 200 feet longer than a quarter mile. It's also shaped different, shorter straightaways and wider, more sweeping highly banked
