**Orangeville's Oldest Resident Dies in Ninety-Eighth Year**

Following an illness of a few days duration, Elizabeth Ann Boggs, oldest resident of Orangeville, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Mabel Watson, Mill Street, with whom she had resided for the past twelve years.

Despite her great age, time had dealt kindly with Mrs. Boggs. Even to those who had known her well, it was difficult to believe that she was drawing close to the century mark. Until the moment of her final illness, she remained remarkably active physically, with a mentality that was keenly alert and attentive. Her memory of events of her past life and of dates, was a source of wonder to all who came in contact with her.

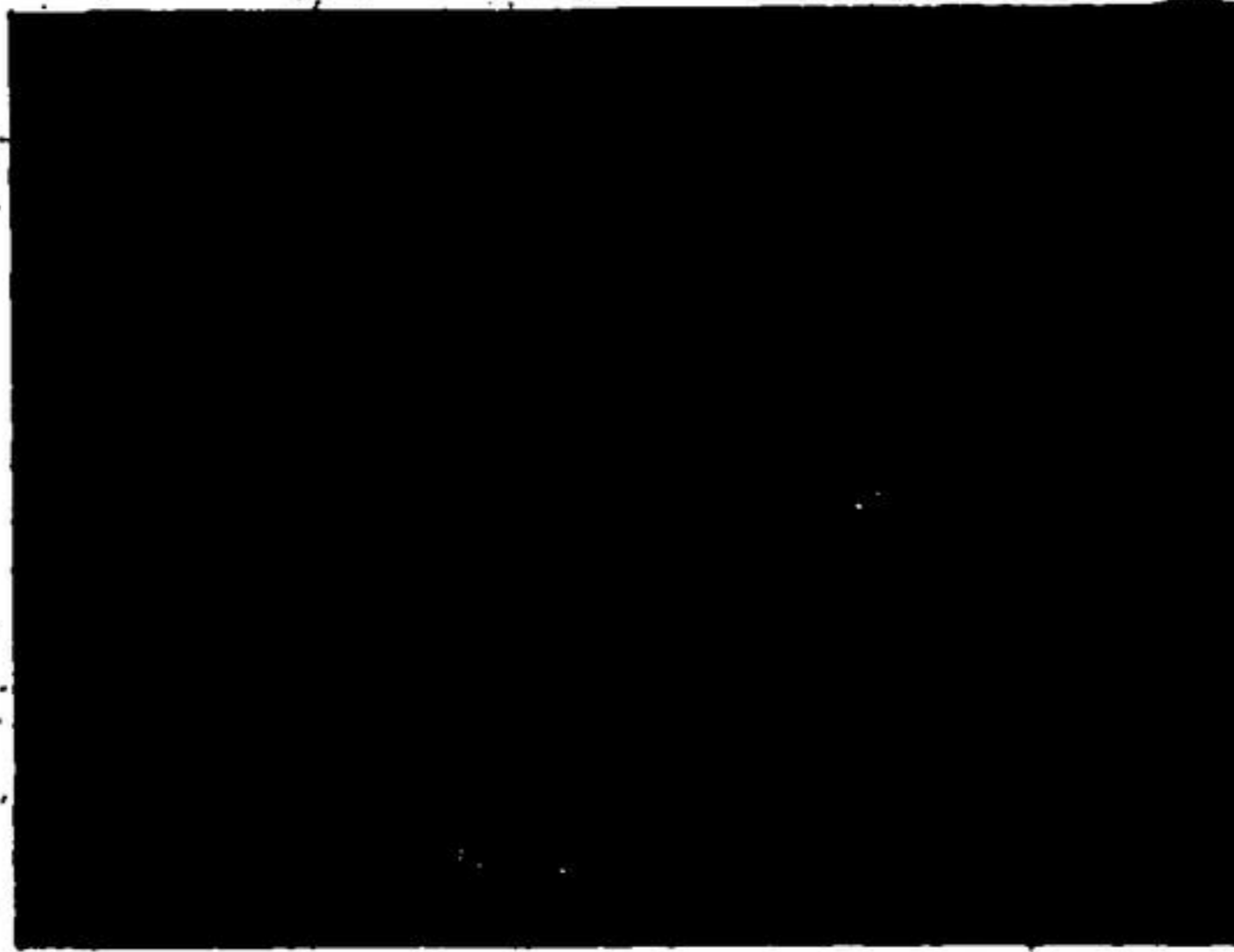
Mrs. Boggs was such a cheerful woman and was at her happiest when members of the three generations of her family were about her. She thoroughly enjoyed good conversation, daily reading and a game of euchre. This latter pastime she indulged in just a few days before her death. A deeply religious woman, she read her Bible daily, and for the past twenty years had been a conscientious reader of the literature of the Christian Science church.

Mrs. Boggs was born in Georgetown. Her maiden name was Elizabeth Ann Warden and her early life, prior to marriage, was spent in East Garafraxa township.

In 1873 she married Wilson Patterson, the ceremony being performed by the Church of England clergyman at Reading, the Rev. Mr. Cole. Mr. Patterson died in 1896. Of this marriage were born four children: Ed Patterson, of Orangeville, who died two years ago, Wilson of Toronto, Mrs. Mabel Watson, of Orangeville and Mrs. R. J. McEwan (Lila) also of Orangeville.

In 1889, at Marsville, the widow married Samuel George Boggs. Of this union there were five children, Stanley, of Orangeville, Mrs. Roy Lowry (Eliza) of Guelph, James, of Fergus, Mrs. Henry Nodwell (Edna) of Orangeville, and Mrs. Horace Nodwell (Mercedes), of Guelph. These blind Egyptian girls are learning to turn out first-rate handicrafts at a Demonstration Center for the Rehabilitation of the Blind which was set up early last year in Cairo with the cooperation of the United Nations Technical Assistance Administration. The Center, which boasts the first Braille Library in the Near East, trains Braille printers, prints textbooks, and teaches people from the region to run similar workshops elsewhere. At the helm is Dr. A. N. McGill, a U.N. expert from Canada who is himself blind. Mildred G. Wallis, U.N. teaching specialist from England stands to check students' work above.

Mr. Boggs died in 1938 in Orangeville shortly after the couple had moved to this town from the farm in East Garafraxa.

In earlier years, Mrs. Boggs attended the Church of England at Reading. In later years, because of age, she was unable to get out to church but had closely followed the precepts of the Christian Science Church. She was a member of the Marsville W.I. and later the Orangeville W.I. until recent years.

The largely attended funeral service was held from the Turner Funeral Home, West Broadway, and was conducted by the Rev. John Bartlett, rector of St. Mark's church. Interment was in Price's Corners Cemetery.

The remains were borne to their last resting place by James Lowry, Hockwood, Stanley Boggs, Jr., Orangeville, Pat Patterson, Toronto, all grandsons; Will Boggs, Grand Valley, a nephew, and Irvin McDougall, Toronto, and Norman Wood, Guelph, who are married to granddaughters.
