Mrs. McMillan Resident Here For Half Century

A resident of Georgetown for over half a century, Mrs. William W. McMillan, 81, died at her home, 81 Emery St. on Thursday. She had been in failing health for several weeks. Formerly Mary M. McDowell, she was the daughter of Samuel McDowell and Margaret Graham, born at Springbrook, between Huttonville and Brampton, her family moved to Ashgrove when she was a girl, and she attended Ashgrove School and lived on the present George Currie property which her father farmed. The family moved to Georgetown in 1893. She was married in Knox Presbyterian Church here in 1902 and until the past few years she was always an active worker in ladies' organizations in the church. Mrs. McMillan passed on her interest in horses to her son Kenneth and family, well-known in hackney show circles. When her granddaughter Joyce was a public school girl, it was a familiar sight to see the two generations out for a ride in the pony cart, and she later took pride in the achievements of Mr. and Mrs. McMillan and Joyce in the show ring at the Royal, the CNE and the dozens of horse shows and fall fairs where they have competed. Her husband died in 1940, and only immediate survivors are her son and granddaughter. She was the last of a family of four. Two sisters, Jessie and Emma, Mrs. E. A. Benham, and a brother James predeceased her. Rev. Alex Calder conducted the funeral service on Monday in Knox Church, pallbearers were Jack Lawson, Everett Cole, William Anderson, Eric McMillan, Stanley Fletcher and Russell King. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

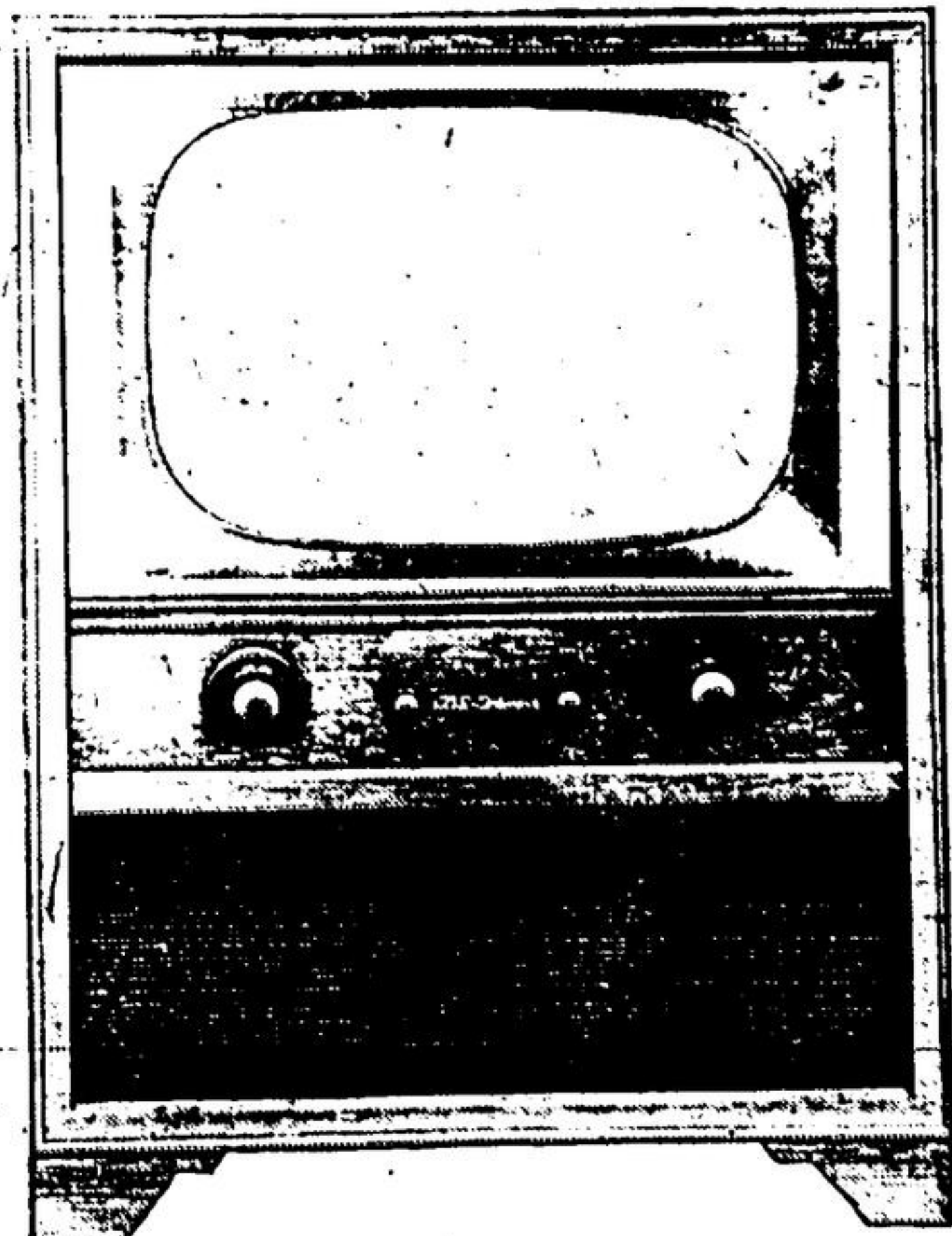


