The high milk producing Jersey for the month of August is Brampton W R Extra producing 15,421 lbs. of milk and 894 lbs. of fat, missing a Gold Certificate by only 6 lbs. Extra is a daughter of Brampton World Records, a superior sire, and is owned by B. H. Bull and Son, of Brampton.
B. H. Bull & Son also have the leader in the mature class in 385 day division on 3 times milking. Qualifying for a Gold Medal certificate, Brampton B P Kava produced 13,665 lbs. of milk and 753 lbs. of fat. Kava is a daughter of the superior sire, Brampton Pinnacle Basil.
In the senior 4 year olds, in the 385 day division, the leader is Eltop Sultan's May, on 2 times milking, producing 11,206 lb. of milk and 631 lbs. of fat. May is owned by R. E. Johnson, Acton.
