The Carling bauble, which carries a total of \$1500 in cash, has never been won by either Cook or Moore thus far. And, with only a few of 8.30 p.m. Saturday meets left at the No. 7 highway stock car track, you can bet your last kopeck that both the above mentioned aces will be striving to pick up every point they can.

Cook, a cartage business owner, has supplanted Moore as the "winning" driver of 1954 at the Joe Cappy - Norm Smith speed factory.

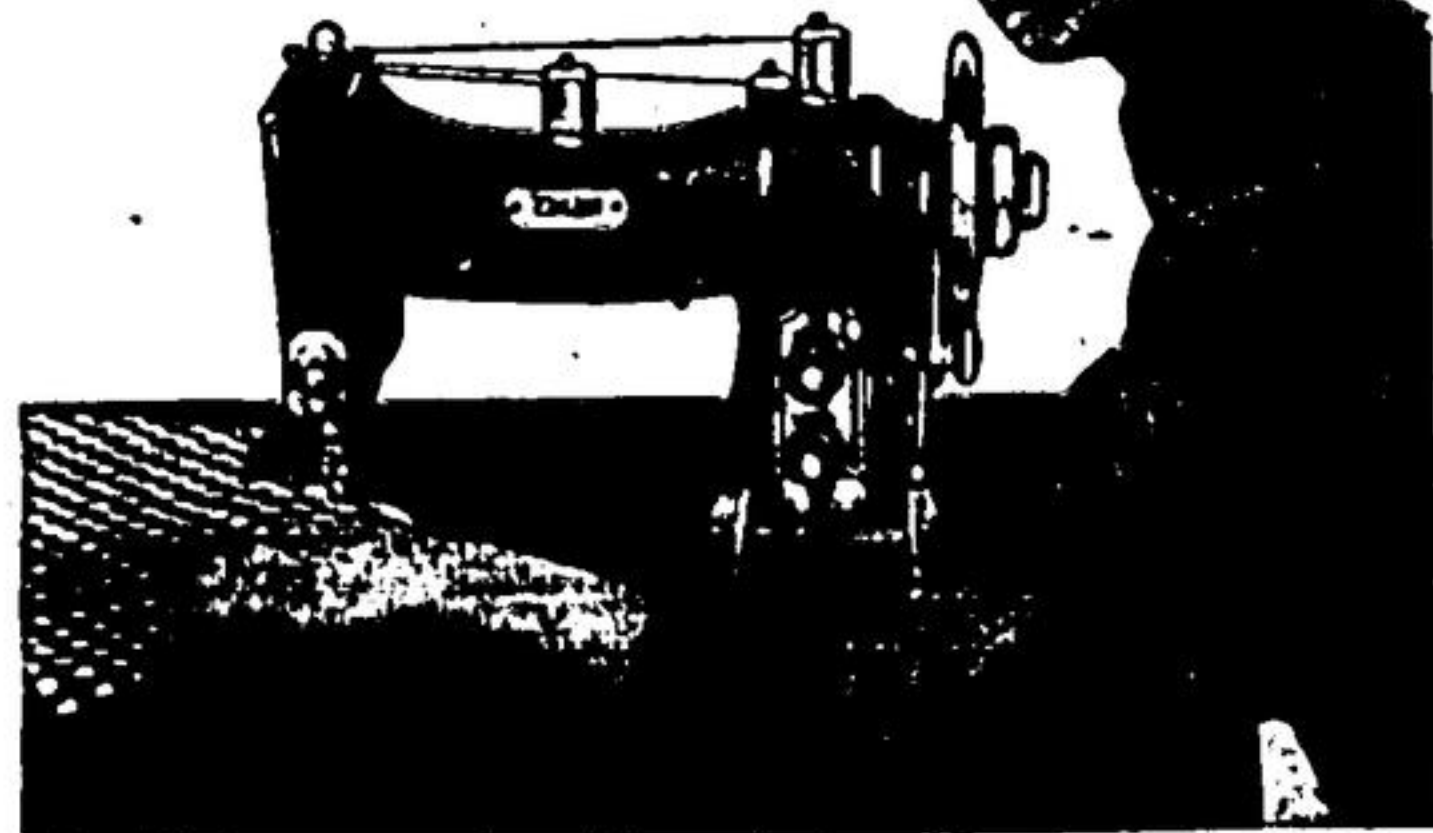
