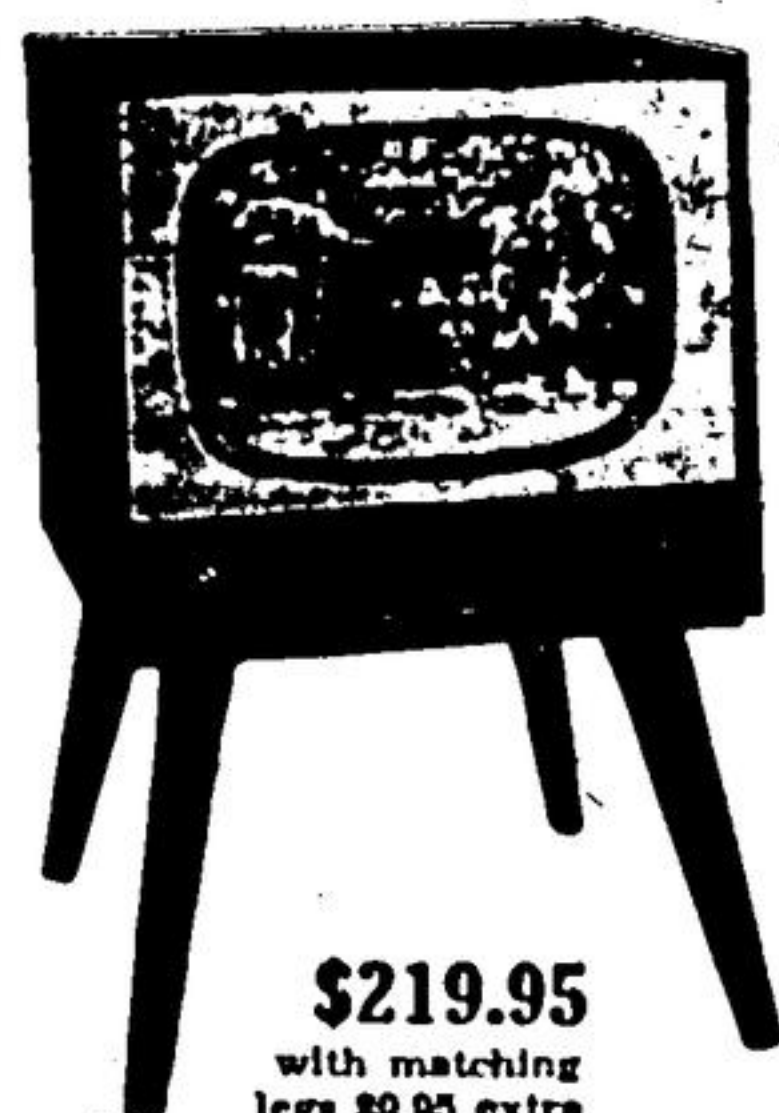

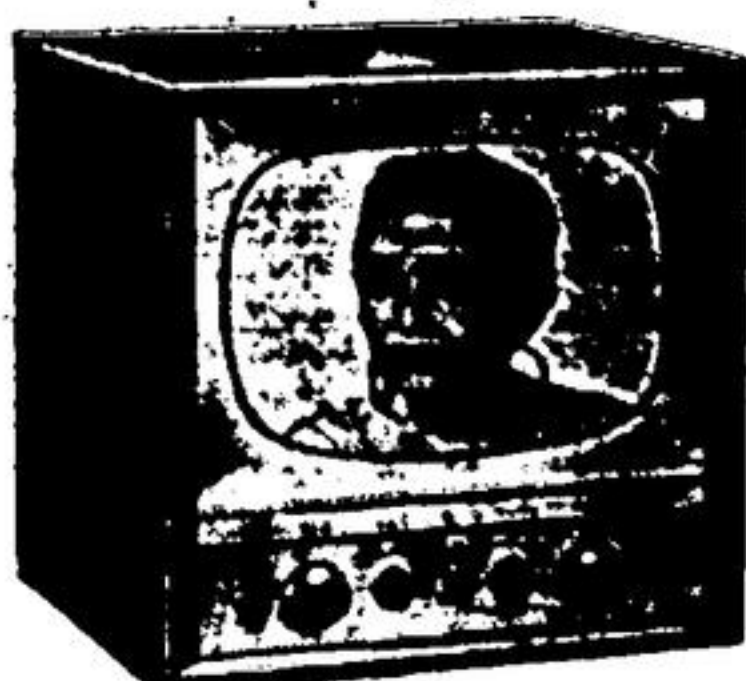

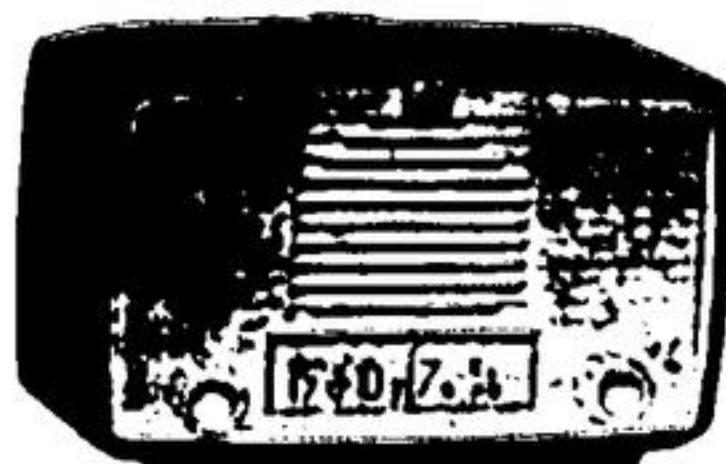

WHAT COUNCIL DID

Brampton Police Will Show Speed Trap Here

Brampton police, at the invitation of Georgetown council, will give a demonstration of the speed trap which successfully catches some 40 speeders daily in that town.

Police chairman Walter Gray has interviewed Brampton officials, and described the 'trap' they devised at a cost of \$50 which has approval of the Attorney General's department.

Council went on record as favouring installation of modern street lighting on the highway from the cenotaph to Wildwood corner.

A \$300 donation toward a banquet for the CNE champion Lorne Scots Band was made.

Council briefly discussed possibility of hiring an industrial commissioner to jointly serve Georgetown, Acton and Milton. The subject has been talked about by the inter-town board which meets periodically. Opinion is that the high wage scale here has an adverse effect on new industries locating.

Deputy Reeve Norton said that a few years ago the board of trade had been told that Georgetown's per capita wage rate was second in Canada only to a gold mining town in the north.

"The cost of living is higher too" quipped Reeve Allen.

Cr. Noble said it might be possible to pay an agency to represent Georgetown, and he had heard of a town which did this. End opinion was that finances this year preclude any action and the matter was shelved.

Second Brother Wins An Atkinson Bursary

Ola Berg, who registered last week at University College, University of Toronto, has followed in his brother's footsteps as a scholarship winner.

Completing his high school education at Georgetown in June, he has been awarded an Atkinson Foundation bursary as well as a University College bursary. The latter gives him \$300 towards his university education. The Atkinson bursary will pay him \$400 this year and a similar amount each year he attends university, providing his standing is satisfactory to the administrators of the Atkinson fund which comes from the estate of Joseph Atkinson, late publisher of the Toronto Daily Star.

Ola is registered in the mathematics and physics course. His brother Elling, who is entering second year engineering, was awarded the Atkinson bursary last year and also won the H. Silver Memorial Award at the school. The boys are sons of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Berg, R. R. 1, Limehouse.
