

### Thomas Treanor, 74 Retired Papermill Employee Dies

A well-known resident of town for over fifty years, Thomas W. Treanor, 74, died suddenly at his home on King Street, October 1st.

After spending his earlier years in Harrison, Michigan, he had been employed by Provincial Paper, Ltd. here for thirty years, and was a member of the firm's Quarter Century Club. Since retirement, his chief interests were in his garden and various sports, especially hockey and baseball. His wife, Cecelia Langan, predeceased him fourteen years ago.

The 102nd anniversary of the Halton Agricultural Society Fair at Milton, saw 277 head of Halton's top Guernseys, Jerseys, and Holsteins participating in the three dairy breed shows.

**Ashville Farms Win**  
The E. J. Meagher Memorial Trophy emblematic of the premier exhibitor award in the annual Halton Holstein Show was won by Ashville Farms Ltd. for the third successive year. 100 head of Black and Whites paraded for Bruce S. Beer, who officiated at the Holstein ring. W. H. Robinson, had the junior and Reserve grand on his winning yearling bull, Hobros Fond Dandy, with the reserve junior award to Ashville Farms first prize junior bull calf, Gordon Sinclair, president of the Halton Club, had the reserve and grand champion bull on his winning two year old Longue Hopeful Salax Prince, that great 7 year old bull of R. C. Alexander, took the red ribbon in the aged bull class and also the reserve senior champion award.

In the female classes, the tops in our opinion were the strongest in the 14 years in which the Halton Holstein Show has been operated. T. H. McGee's senior heifer calf Haigertice Jean Hope which placed first at the CNE, repeated and went on to take the junior female championship. The reserve went to another Fond Hope CNE prize winner, that of Gordon Sinclair's, which placed first in the senior yearling class.

In the senior female classes Harold Cooper's Kneland Farm Annabel which was the reserve grand at the CNE, took both the senior and grand championship awards. The reserve senior and reserve grand went to the outstanding milking three year old of Tovell Bros., Elmbank Sovereign Kay, which was a strong contender for the red ribbon at the CNE.
