

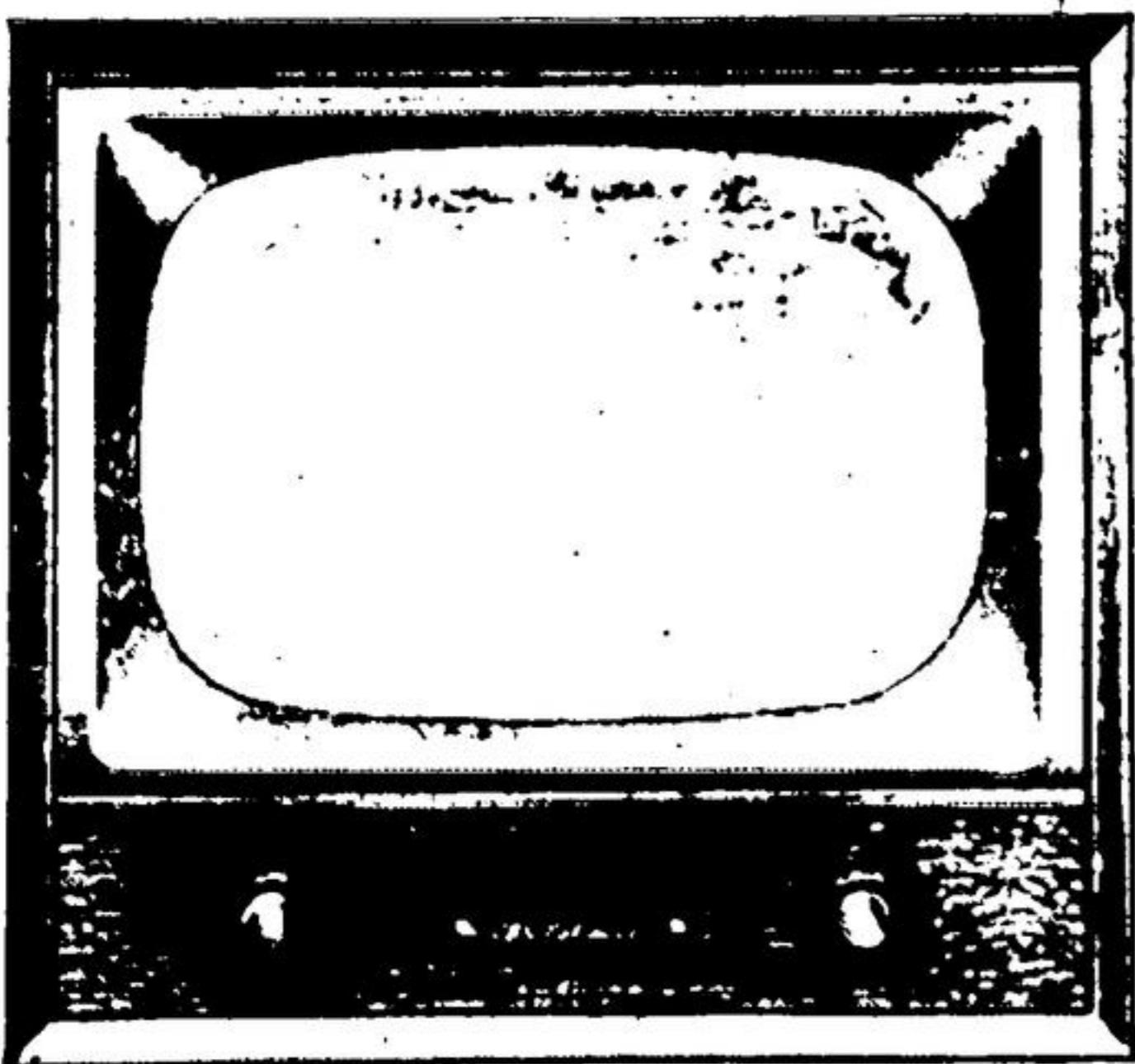
**MUSKRAT RAMBLES!**
