**Maurice Manderson Joins Dale and Bennett Law Firm**

A new lawyer appears on the local scene this week when Maurice Manderson becomes associated with Dale & Bennett in their law practice on Mill Street.

Mr. Manderson and his family moved here from Dresden last week and are living in the new Sunbeam Heights subdivision on Tyers Ave. Mr. and Mrs. Manderson have two children, Billy 12 and Bobby 5 who will be attending Grade 7 and kindergarten at Wrigglesworth School.

Dresden is Mr. Manderson's home town and his mother still lives there. His father, the late Howard Manderson, established a plumbing business there over half a century ago which is still operated by his son and namesake, Howard, Jr.

After graduation from the University of Western Ontario, London, where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1933 Mr. Manderson attended Osgoode Hall, graduating in 1936. He worked for two years in the succession duties branch of the Ontario treasury department in Toronto, then established a law practice in Timmins where he enlisted in the HCAF in 1943.

During his airforce term as a flight lieutenant, he was attached to the office of the Judge Advocate General, Ottawa, and was stationed at various airforce camps in Western Canada including Winnipeg and Weyburn.

In 1946, he took over the law practice of the late George Weir in Dresden. In Dresden, he has been

an active community worker as secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and on the executive of Branch 113, Canadian Legion. The family attends the Presbyterian Church.

During his university days, Mr. Manderson played soccer and hockey and was a member of the UWO intercollegiate hockey team.

His wife, the former Sylvia Thompson of Toronto and Sault Ste Marie is the daughter of Rev. W. H. Thompson who was a Methodist minister in Toronto at the time of his death.
