## \$8,000,000 for New Steel Plant

H. G. Hilton, president of the Steel Company of Canada Limited, has informed shareholders of that company that a new and improved continuous galvanizing plant in Hamilton will cost \$8,000,000. It will deliver sheet steel, galvanized on both sides, completely finished and ready for shipment at the rate of 200 feet per minute. The widths will be up to four feet and the diversified market will be better supplied than it ever has been before. Production will begin next year, some time after July 1st.

The farmers of Canada are among the principal users of galvanized metal but during the war and subsequently there was a serious shortage and it is expected that the new plant will be fully utilized, especially in view of the growing population.

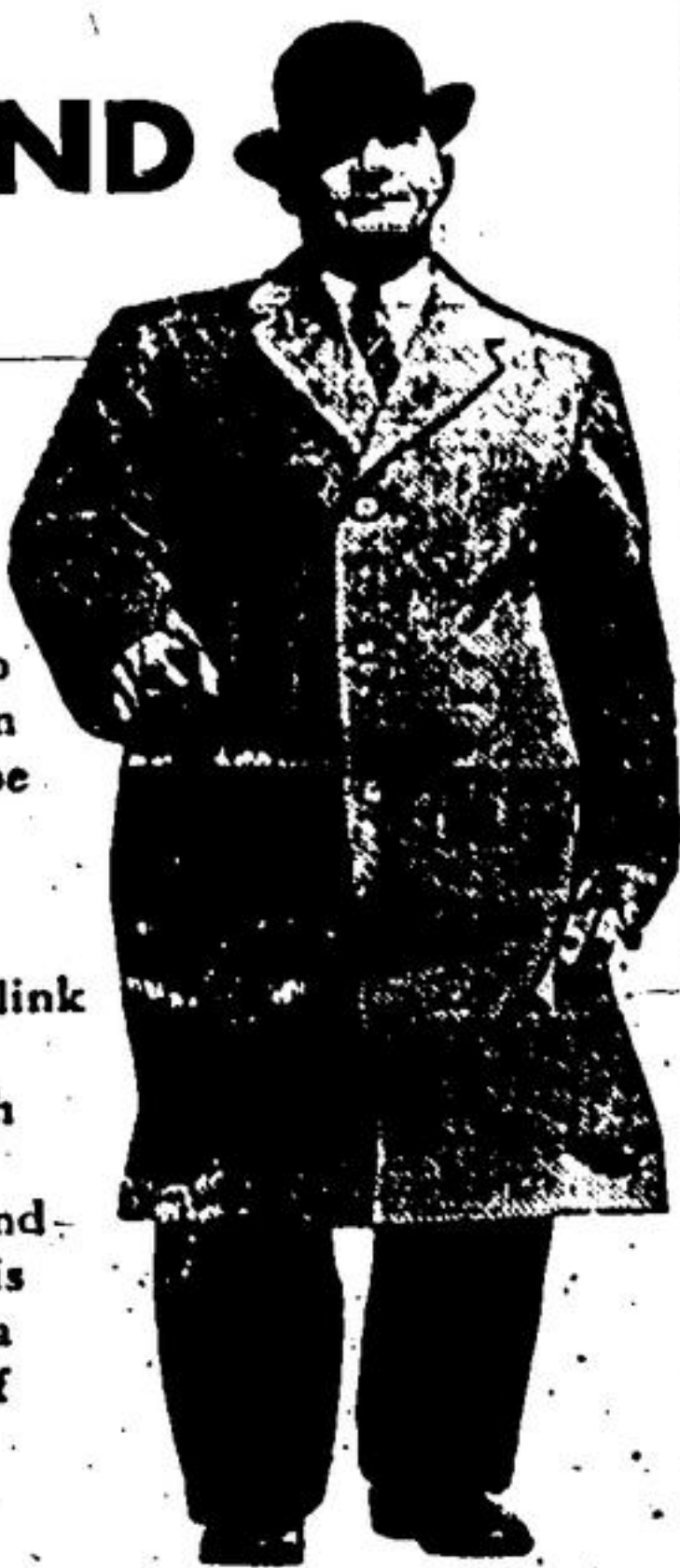

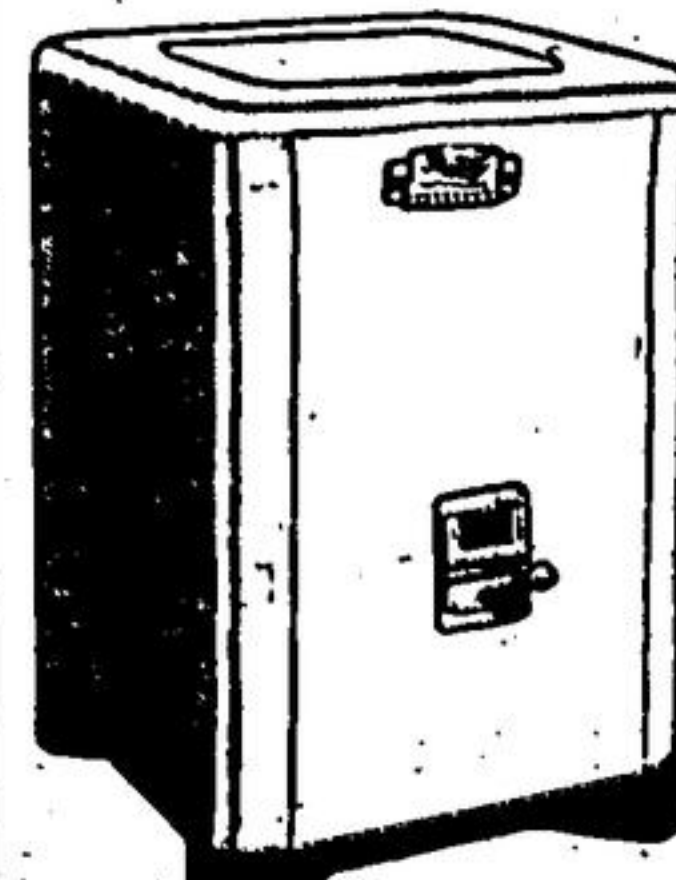
