

### Farm Population Only 11%-Farm Forum Speaker

When the County Farm Forum committee met on Monday evening, October 25th, with chairman, Mr. S. Turner presiding, they listended to an inspiring address delivered by Federation Fieldman, Mr. Ray Hergott, a Waterloo county farmer.

He impressed us with the important part Farm Forums play in the agricultural field and in the rural areas. We who are directly involved in the forum programme in Ontario should strive to make it a much stronger organization than it is not the present tune. We as farmers, are going to have to face up to the proplems shead and we can only accomplish this through strong active farm forum groups. The Pederation of Agriculture must also do a better job, by having the individual farmer make his contributton in the game of rural living. We have rural problems to face, such as no other group has had to face before. With the fact before us that the agricultural population must realize we cannot bulldoze our ous activities, projects, and results heard and as it should be heard. If any problem which we have to face. we make statements we must be able to prove these statements.

Farm forums have a basic job to do, as they are a neighboring group meeting weekly to discuss agricultural problems from a personal point of view. We must read, discuss and act.
