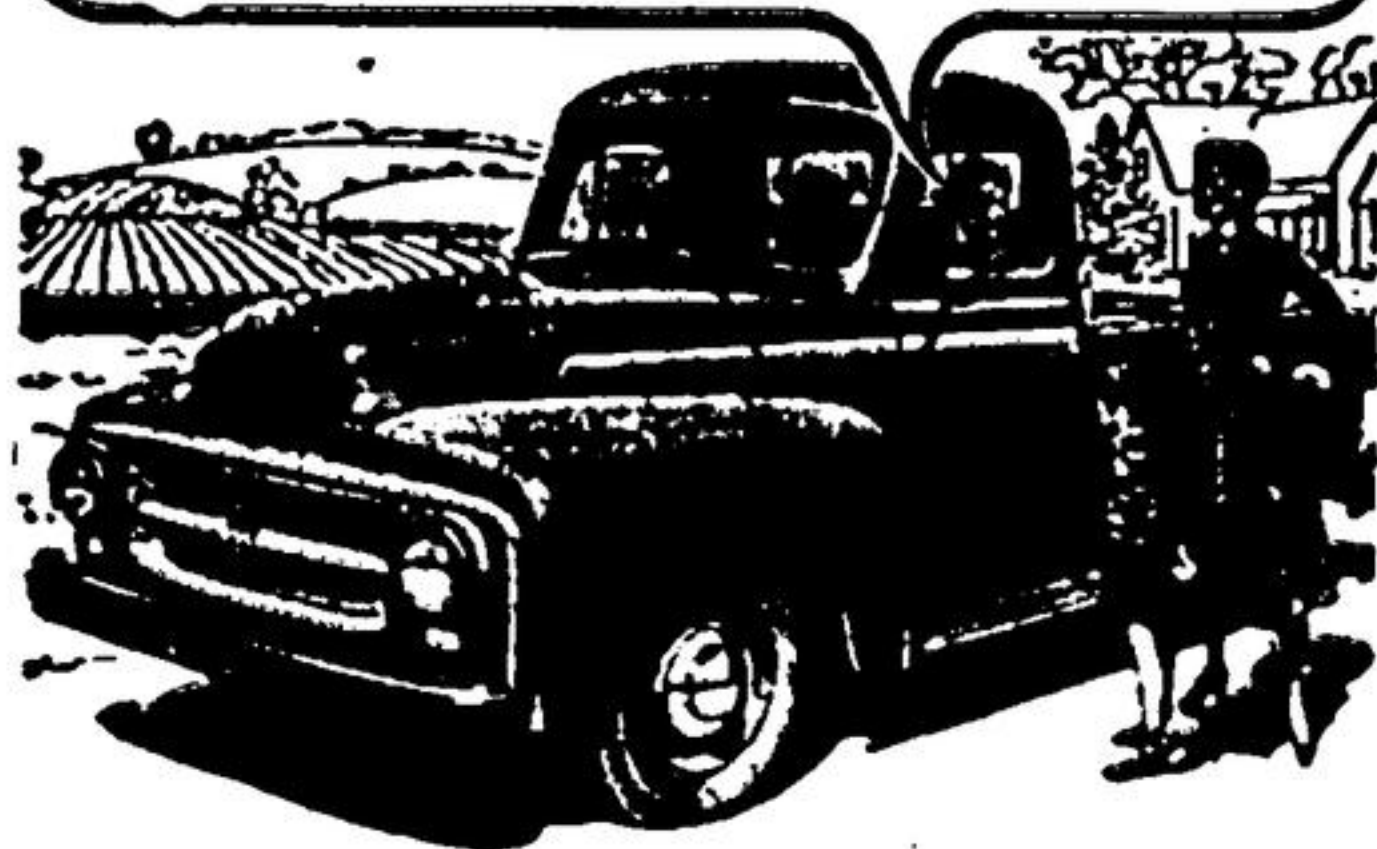

As soon as news of the tragedy spread, this local organization got to work assembling canned goods and other staples which were sent to Salvation Army headquarters in Brampton, along with an immediate cash donation of \$14. The ladies also thought of the immediate food problem and baked cakes and pies and made sandwiches which were rushed to Woodbridge to feed stricken families and relief workers.

Others helped the institute in rounding up supplies and thanks to them was expressed at last Wednesday's meeting at the home of Mrs. Frank Robinson, Ostrander Blvd. Another cash donation of \$50 was voted at the meeting, which will be sent through the local collection agency.

"Back to the Farm" was the program theme, with Mrs. Herb Cleave in charge. Mrs. Seward Wilson and Mrs. W. T. Sinclair took part in the program which centered around this.

Mrs. George Campbell gave the motto. Homes are the greenhouses where plants of citizenship grow. Mrs. V. Lawson told of the area convention at the Guelph OAC where guest speaker Mrs. Kate Aitken stressed her belief that Canadians have not enough faith in the products which this country manufactures.

The meeting discussed the new stone park gates which they promoted, along with the Chamber of Commerce. The main installation was made in time for fall fair day, and the gates will be completed later this year.

This is the Schedule referred to above:

ALL AND SINGULAR those certain parcels or tracts of land situated, lying and being in the Township of Esqueping, in the County of Halton and Province of Ontario, being composed of parts of Lots Numbers Seventeen and Sixteen (Nos. 17 and No. 16) and Lots Numbers Fifteen, Fourteen and Thirteen (Nos. 15, No. 14 and No. 13) in Concession 10, and parts of Lots Numbers Thirteen, Fourteen and Fifteen (Nos. 13, No. 14 and No. 15) and Lot Number Sixteen in Concession 9 in the said Township of Esqueping, and which said parcels or tracts of land may be more particularly described as follows:—

COMMENCING at an angle in the Easterly boundary of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown, being the intersection of the centre line of the road allowance between Concessions No. 9 and No. 10 with the centre line of the road allowance between Lots Numbers Seventeen and Eighteen (No. 17 and No. 18);

THENCE Southwesterly along the said last mentioned Southeasterly limit of the Southwest half of Lot Number Ten (No. 10) and its intersection Southwesterly to its intersection with the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions No. 9 and No. 10;
