ALL AND SINGULAR those certain parcels or tracts of land situate, lying and being in the Township of Esquesing, in the County of Halton and Province of Ontario being composed of parts of Lots Numbers Seventeen and Sixteen (No. 17 and No. 16) and Lots Numbers Fifteen, Fourteen and Thirteen (No. 15, No. 14 and No. 13) in Concession 10, and parts of Lots Numbers Thirteen, Fourteen and Fifteen (No. 13, No. 14 and No. 15) and Lot Number Sixteen in Concession 9 in the said Township of Esquesing, and which said parcels or tracts of land may be more particularly described as follows:
