Norval Presbyterians Dedicate New Windows

A memorable service was held in Norval Presbyterian Church on Sunday when the new Medallion Windows were dedicated by the Moderator of Presbytery, the Rev. William Weir of Brampton. The church was tastefully decorated with mums, and

a large congregation was present, almost filling the village church to capacity. The Rev. G. L. Royal opened the service and Hymns 816 and 111 were sung. The Apostle's Creed was repeated by the congregation and Psalm 122 was read responsively. Mr. Weir then read from the Scriptures, Chronicles Chapter 29 and Matthew Chapter 7. Mr. Ronald Perry then

favoured the congregation with a suitable rendition of "Bless This House." After the singing of Hymn 809 Mr. Weir dedicated the Medallion Windows with prayer. Mr. Weir's text was the fitting 9th verse of Psalm 98 — "O Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness." He began by expressing the gratitude and congratulations of Toronto West Presbytery

and of his own congregation at Brampton. He told of his early experiences in a little mud church in Saskatchewan, a church that in its humble beginning had neither pulpit, nor organ, neither baptismal font nor pews — when the walls were whitewashed by a woman member of the congregation in an attempt to beautify the house of God, just as the mem-

bers of Norval Presbyterian Church were trying to beautify their church with the new medallion windows, replacing those that had stood the test of the past seventy-six years. He pointed out that the word "worship" meant an act of ascribing "worth" to God. He emphasized that there should be no feeling of self-satisfaction which of course would be con-

trary to our Christian teaching. The windows, beautiful and significant as they were, were not absolutely essential to our worship of God. Real worship was a heart (tuned to the will of God), "a humble and a contrite heart" and a sincere attempt to bring our worship of God into the kitchen, the farm and the factory — there only was the true "beauty of holiness."

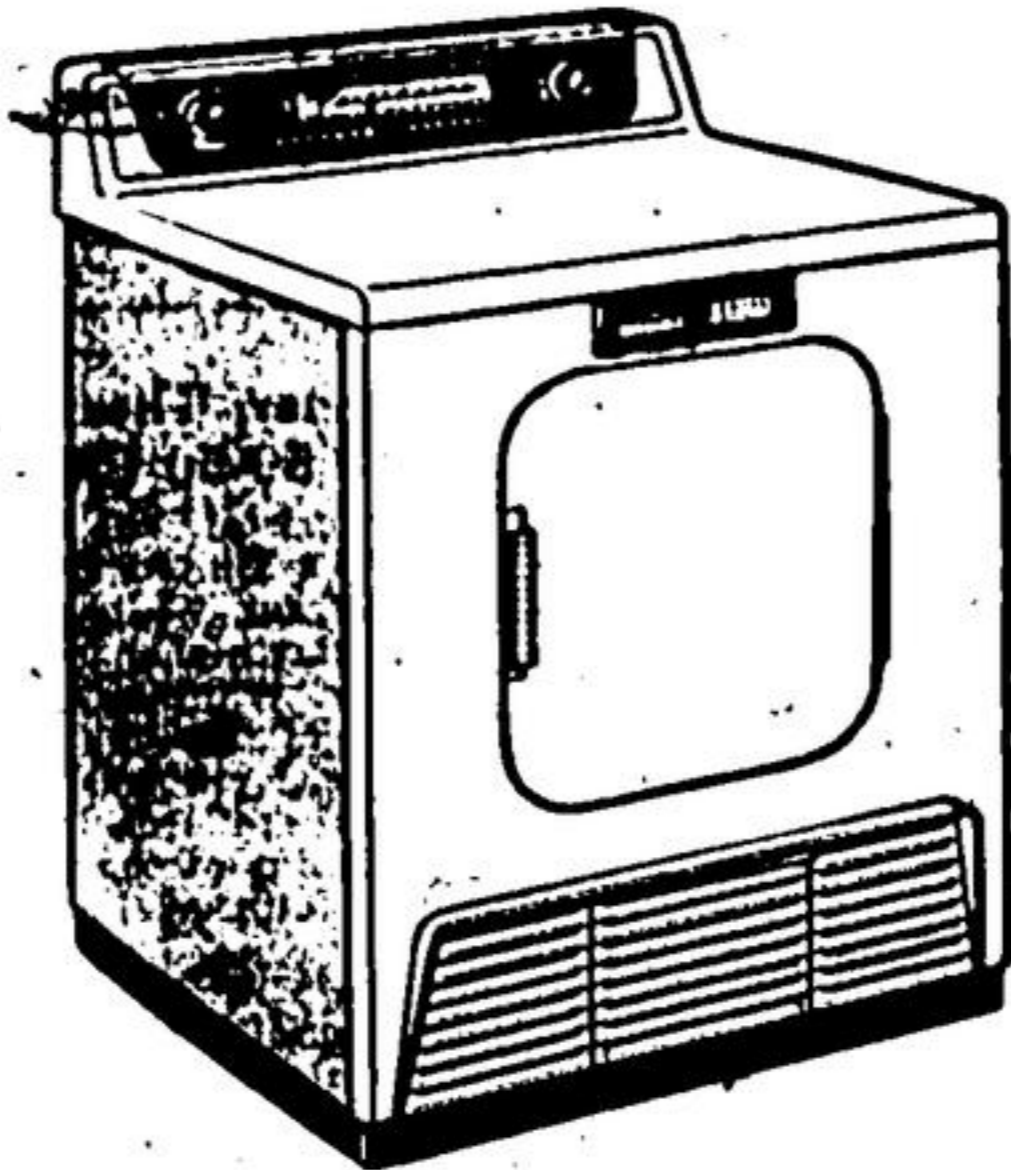
