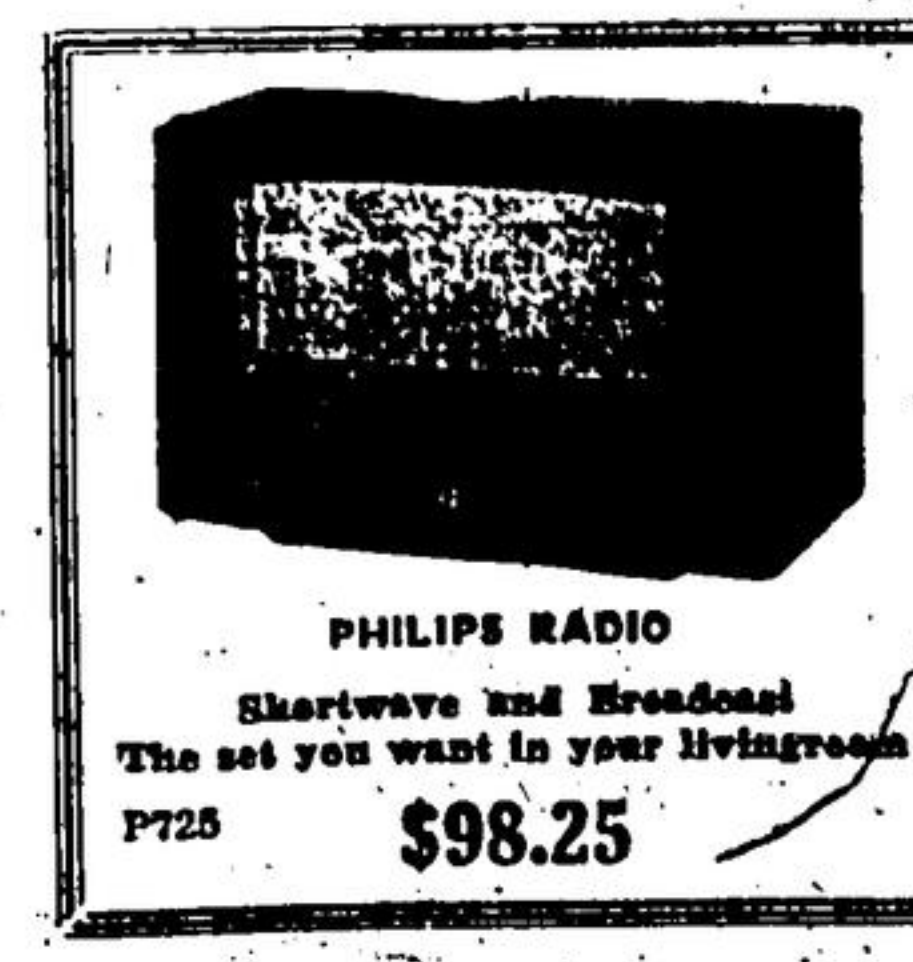

## Georgetown Couple Tour Continent This Summer

Just recently, Mrs. Chris Sargent received an interesting letter from her daughter, Mrs. Andy Molozzi, telling about a trip they and another young couple living in England, took on the continent this summer. Mrs. Molozzi is the former Margaret Sargent. She and her husband went to live in England last year after Andy, a graduate of Georgetown High School and of the University of Toronto in engineering, won the Athlone Scholarship entitling him to two years' study at the university of his choice in England. The young couple toured the continent in a small English car, to the amusement and interest of quite a number of people. Here are some excerpts from the letter:

"We left London for Dover on Monday morning, July 12th. Our ship sailed at 1300 hours. For some peculiar reason we got the idea that 1300 was 3 o'clock. We arrived in Dover about 12 and just hung around the stores till about 2, when we went to the docks. Of course our ship had already sailed. Fortunately the association were able to get us passage on a mail boat, which sailed at 5.45. However, we couldn't drive our car on—it had to be lifted in and out—not so good for the old crate.

"It took us about four hours to reach Ostend, Belgium. I don't think the water was terribly rough but nevertheless I was as sick as a dog (never make a sailor I guess). Andy was O.K. though.

"It was dark when we reached Ostend, but we managed to find a camp site without too much trouble, pitched our tents, cooked our supper and went to bed.

"Next morning we set out for Holland. We didn't see a great deal of Belgium this time, but the general impression was that the people are very well to do. They all drive new American cars and the houses more closely resemble those in Canada than any we've seen.

"Holland—very flat. Hardly saw any wooden shoes or windmills. When we reached Eindhoven, we inquired at the police station about camp sites, whereupon we were given a motorcycle escort to a site about 10 miles from the town. We were quite impressed. It was five o'clock and the big Philips factory was just getting out as well as all the other industries. I never saw so many bicycles in all my life—there were literally hundreds. When we came to a stop sign there were cycles in front, on either side, and behind. We were completely surrounded.

"The next day we woke to rain. After breakfast, we started on our way. We had lunch in a restaurant in Holland. They gave us a great big bowl of French fries and when we had finished those, they took the bowl away and filled it up again. We had steak and potatoes, dessert and a beverage for under 75c each. We did some shopping in the stores and found they had everything imaginable—lovely stores.

"We then continued on to Germany. It was getting very dark and we couldn't find a camp site anywhere. It was still raining and we had nothing on top of the car to cover our bedding. Finally we had to resort to finding a hotel room where we spread out all our bedding to dry. You should see the size of the German beds. They're immense—would hold a whole family I'm sure. Our bedding was soaked and our bags had leaked causing the dye to run on all our clothes. Fun!

"Left next morning and drove all along the Rhine River. The scenery here is absolutely wonderful. There are hundreds of vineyards planted on the sides of very steep hills. I'll never know how they manage to work them. It's really something to see. We stopped to take some pictures.

"We camped at Frankfurt that night and next day set out "in the pouring rain." In the afternoon our car started making peculiar noises. The boys were unable to locate the trouble, so we continued on to Heidelberg, where we found a camp site. However, the water was lying just like a lake and we didn't see how we could possibly camp in it, especially since the rain was still coming down in buckets. So we drove to a garage and found that they wouldn't be able to have the car ready till Monday (this was Friday). That settled the matter. We sure couldn't afford a hotel room 3 nights, so we went back to the camp site. Monday came—no car—promised for Tuesday—Tuesday for Wednesday—Wednesday for Thursday. We finally got it late Thursday night. All this time (excepting Thursday), it had rained continually. We were forced to buy a fly sheet so we could do our cooking. Our tents were so small that if you touched them, they leaked. Naturally I touched ours. Some fun! My feet were soaking wet for a solid week—and I came through without even a sniffle. It's really unbelievable. Not one of us (continued on Page 7)
