 suffered ill effects. It was one awful week though, and we'll always remember Heidelberg. While we were there, we took a railway car to the top of the mountain, which was very interesting, and of course did quite a bit of sight seeing—in the pouring rain.
 "On at 5:30 Friday morning to try and make up for lost time. We drove through the Black Forest, which is really out of this world—very beautiful. Noticed many women working in the fields—many ox carts. Camped beside Lake Constance. Next morning crossed lake in car ferry—drove till dark, when we crossed into Austria, and camped for the night.
 "Next morning we started to drive up, up, up. The mountain scenery was beautiful. The car wouldn't make some of the hills, with everybody in, so three of us walked up. That evening we camped in a field. Next morning when we were getting breakfast, the farmer let 35 cows in the field. We had laundry drying on the tents and some of them attempted to get that. We managed to shoo them away and then one came up to me and started sniffing around our food. It knocked over our sugar and picked up a loaf of bread. All this time I was yelling my head off. Marion tried to push the cow away and of course it was like putting her weight against a stone wall. There was a busload of people camped there (about 40), and while all this was going on, they were all just about in hysterics.
 "We were most impressed with Austria. It's a very beautiful country and everything is very cheap. One day Marion and I walked into a store with the equivalent of 37 cents, and asked for steak for four. We got it too.
 "Drove through mountainous country into Switzerland where we camped for the night—very expensive. Next day started climbing—camped on mountain side—lots of snow on mountain tops.
 "Ascended St. Gotthard pass—a dilly. When we reached the top (walked a good deal of the way),
