

(continued from Page 5) suffered ill effects. It was one awful week though, and we'll always remember Heidelberg. While we were there, we took a railway car to the top of the mountain, which was very interesting, and of course did quite a bit of sight seeing-in

the pouring rain. "Uu at 5.30 Friday morning to try and make up for lost time. We drove through the Black Forest, which is really out of this worldvery beautiful. Noticed many women working in the fields-many ox carts. Camped beside Lake Constance. Next morning crossed lake in car ferry-drove till dark, when we crossed into Austria, and camped for the night.
