Dr. Norman High-Speaker At 4-H Awards Night

Milton High School auditorium was filled to capacity Friday night with 4-H Club members, their parents, friends, Club Leaders, and the prize donors. The occasion was the second annual 4-H Awards Night, where every 4-H Club Member who completed a project in one or more of the six Halton 4-H Clubs received prize money.

Dr. Norman High, director of the Two Year Associate Course at the OAC, who was introduced by Don Johnson, and thanked by Norman Bird, addressed the gathering. Challenging the 4-H Club Members to develop their character in early life by taking advantage of training in churches, schools, and 4-H Clubs, so that they would make the best decisions in later life. Dr. High in his very pleasing manner compared our way of life to that of our ancestors and pointed out advantages and disadvantages of each way of life. Another interesting feature of his address was the showing of a film, "What Do You Think?"

The first presentation was a 4-H Pin to each of the 33 members who completed their first 4-H Project this year. Art Bennett made this presentation, in the absence of Reeve George Brenholz, chairman of the Agricultural Committee of County Council.

John Pickett, club leader of the Halton 4-H tractor club, handed out the awards to his club members paying particular tribute to Don Johnson and Andy Stull, who recently won the Inter-Club tractor competition at Guelph, and to Harold Lawrence who was judged the best tractor driver at the Georgetown Fair. Andy Stull was high contestant in this club.

Fred Nurse, with the help of J. E. Whitelock, secretary of the Halton Soil & Crop Improvement Club, awarded prizes to members of the 4-H Grain and 4-H Forage Clubs. Special mention was made of the contribution these two clubs made to the Junior Section of Milton Fair. Both won red ribbons for their first efforts in the educational display class. Don Cleave and Norman Bird were the respective winners in the Forage and Grain Clubs.

Ray Currie, president of the Halton Agricultural Society, and Mrs. George Readhead, secretary, were on hand to assist with presentations to the members of the three Calf Clubs, which are sponsored by that Society.

Sandy Buchanan, club leader for the Halton 4-H Beef and Dual Purpose Club, assisted by Grant Campbell, president of the Ontario Short-horn Club, and Roy Currie, presented prizes to members of this club. Sandy paid special tribute to Dawn Coulter, who in addition to having the best Dual Purpose Calf at her Achievement Day, won first prize; Junior Champion and Reserve Senior Champion with her Red Poll calf at the CNE, and won 1st at the Royal, and to Katherine Merry for her wins at Milton, Erin, CNE and the Royal. Katherine obtained the highest aggregate score in this club.

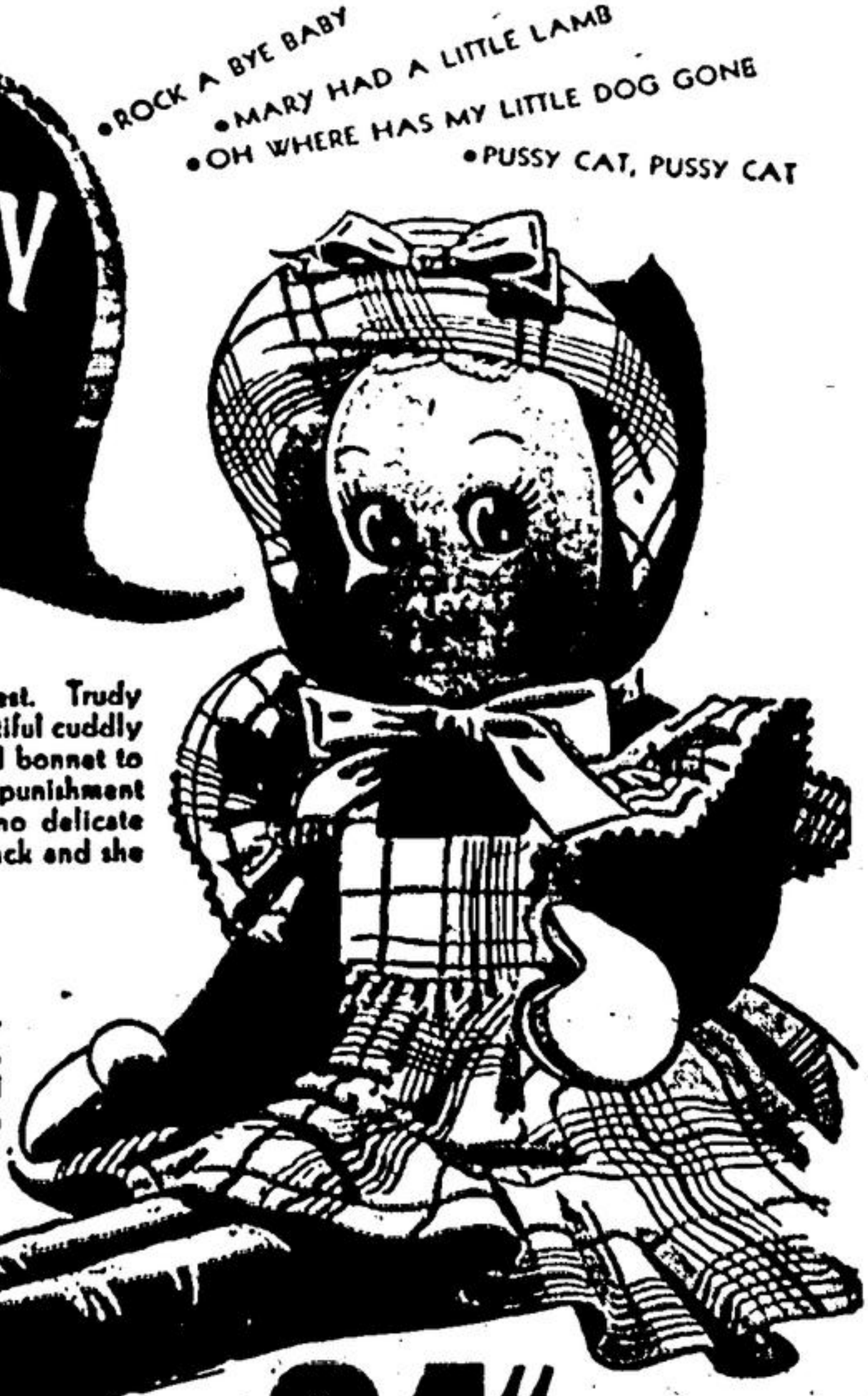

George Pelletier, vice-chairman of the Club Leaders' Council, announced the awards for the Holstein 4-H Calf Club Chief winner in this large club of 55 members was Norman Bird, who received the Duffray trophy, and a model of the true type Holstein cow, from Gordon Sinclair, president of the Halton Holstein Breeders Club. Special mention was made that George Bird and Carole Hunter exhibited the best Junior and Senior Holstein calves respectively.

Following the presentation to Club Members, J. E. Whitelock, Agricultural Representative, presented Club Leaders' Pins to the previously mentioned club leaders, and to twelve others who have assisted with the 4-H Club Programme over the years.

Katherine Merry, who brought honour to herself and Halton County, by winning the Queen's Guinness award at the Royal Winter Fair, received several presentations.

R. G. Bennett, Associate Director of Extension, Ontario Department of Agriculture, spoke briefly of Katherine's achievements and true sportsmanship, and presented her with the T. L. Kennedy trophy the official certificate, and cheque for \$250.00.

Next Grant Campbell presented a cheque, on behalf of the Ontario Short-horn Breeders' Club, and finally, on behalf of all Halton 4-H members, Sandy Buchanan, Evelyn McKay and Dawn Coulter, concluded the programme with the presentation of an inscribed Silver Tray.
