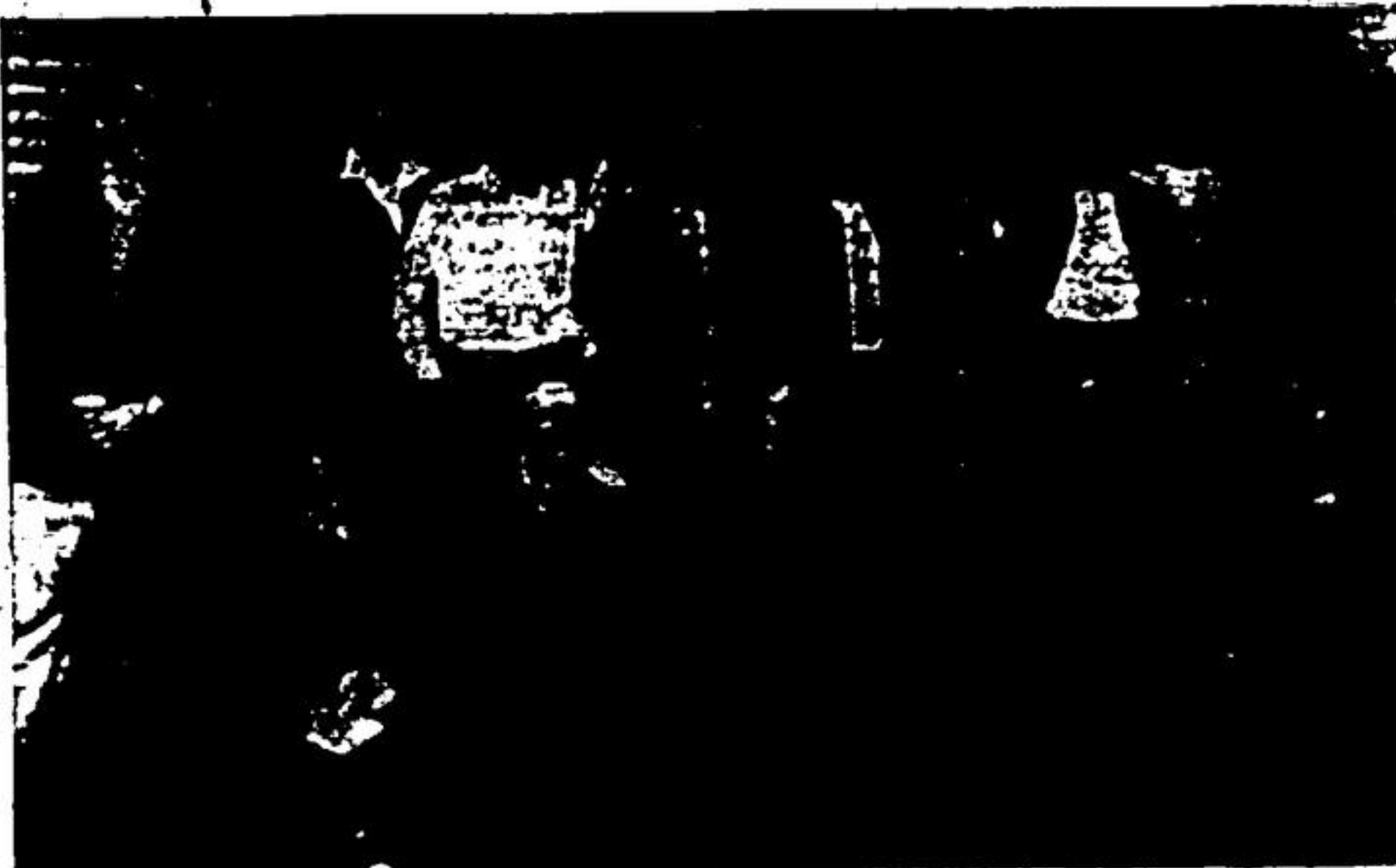

One of Stewarttown's most prominent citizens, Mrs. Walter Lawson, Sr., 88, was buried in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown last week. She died in Peel Memorial Hospital on November 25th.

Rev. Alex Calder conducted the funeral service at the McClure Funeral Home and six nephews were pallbearers, John Fisher of St. Louis, Michigan, and William, Gordon, George, James T., and Lloyd Fisher, all residents of this district.

The former Mary Adeline (Minnie) Fisher, Mrs. Lawson was the daughter of William and Mary Miller Fisher. She was born in the Scotch Block on her parents' farm, Lot 9, concession 5, Esquimaux.

She attended Quatre Bras school, and was a member of Boston Presbyterian Church and Knox Church, Georgetown. She was married on January 15th, 1890, and spent all her married life in Stewarttown.

Mrs. Lawson was a member of Esquimaux Women's Institute since its formation in 1912, and served as president for a number of years. Predeceased by her husband in 1923, she is survived by three children, Mrs. Joseph H. Hunter (Jean) of Norval, Walter of Stewarttown and William F. of Toronto. There are three grandchildren, W. Robert and Donald G. Lawson, Stewarttown and Mary Elizabeth Lawson, Toronto.

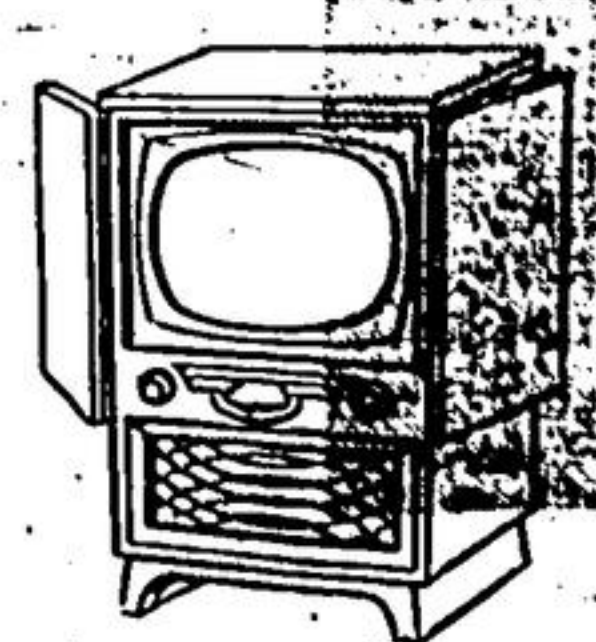
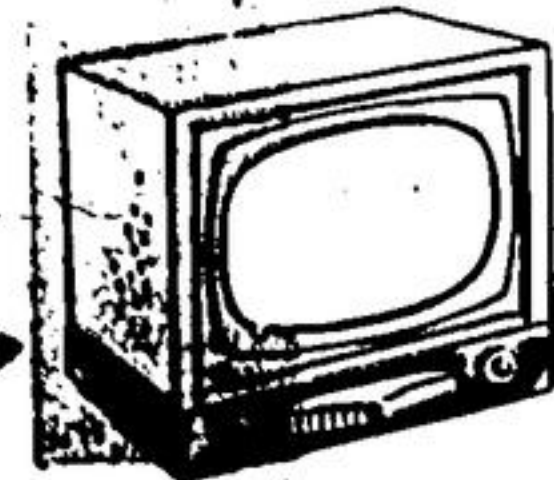
