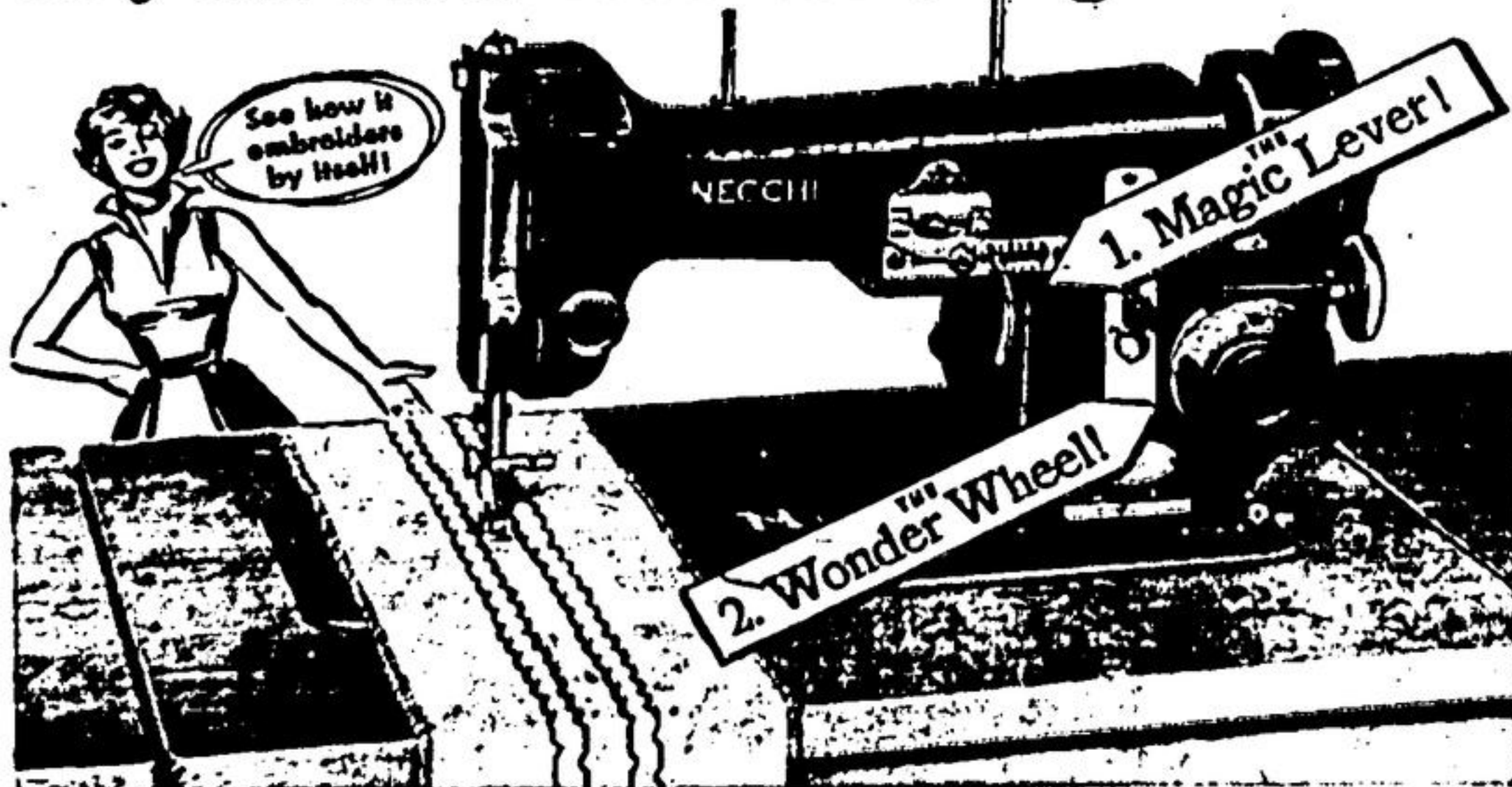

**Approve Additions at Acton, Milton Schools**

Five North Halton municipalities which share costs of the high school district administering schools in Georgetown, Milton and Acton have agreed to a plan for additions to the Acton and Milton schools.

Councils of the three towns, and those of Esqueping and Nassagaweya townships have all passed resolutions favouring the proposal of the school board for a \$30,000 two-room Milton addition and a \$40,000 addition of three rooms to the Acton building which was just completed this year.

Snowballing growth of all three towns has made it difficult to keep up with growing high school enrolment. The problem is even more complex in Georgetown which faces a proposed subdivision which would dwarf the present building which also had a substantial addition constructed this year. It has been decided to make do with present accommodation until the new Heslop subdivision gets underway, and all indications point to a complete new high school for Georgetown in the near future.
