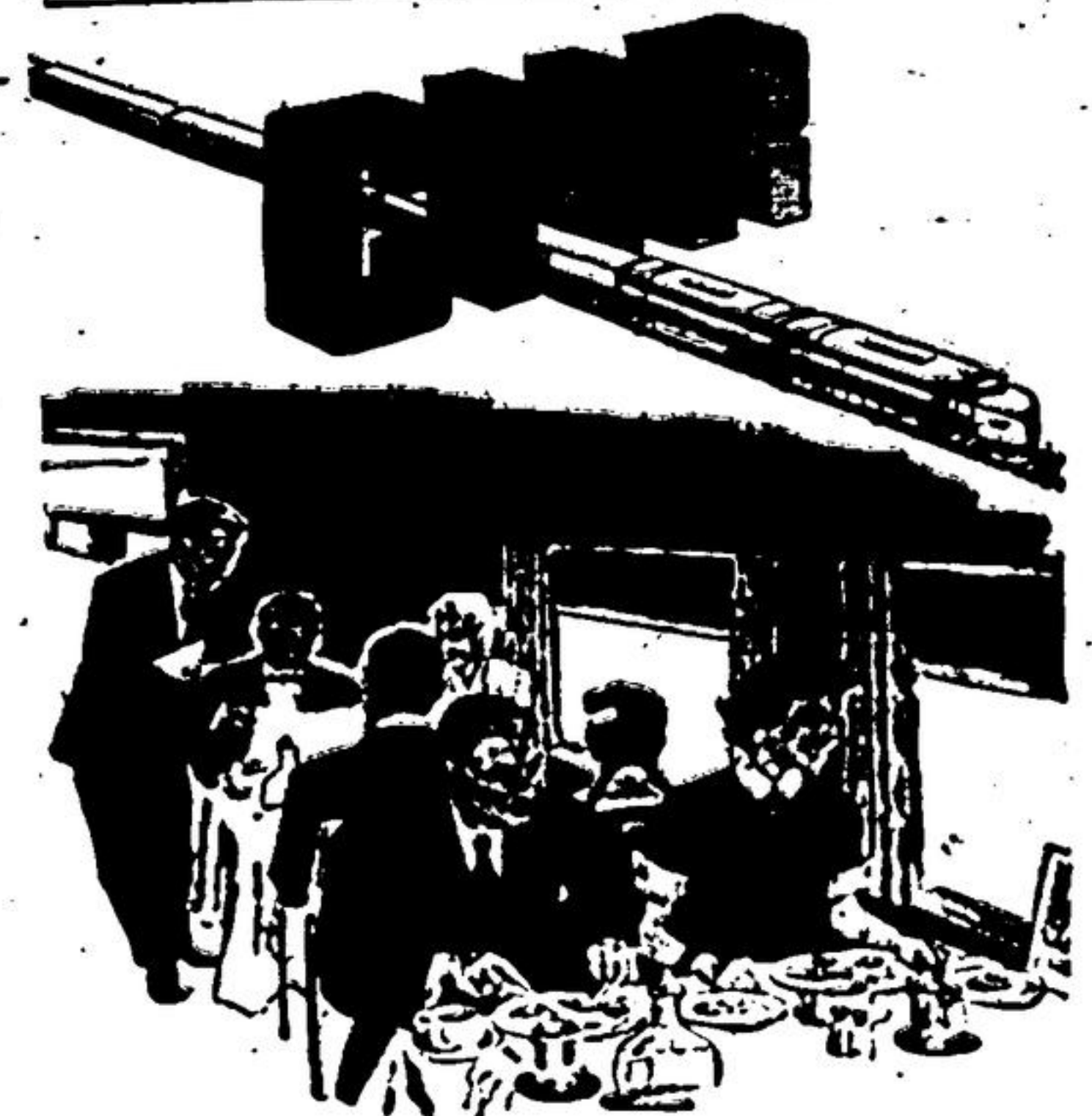


LORNE SCOTS CHANGE OF COMMAND
