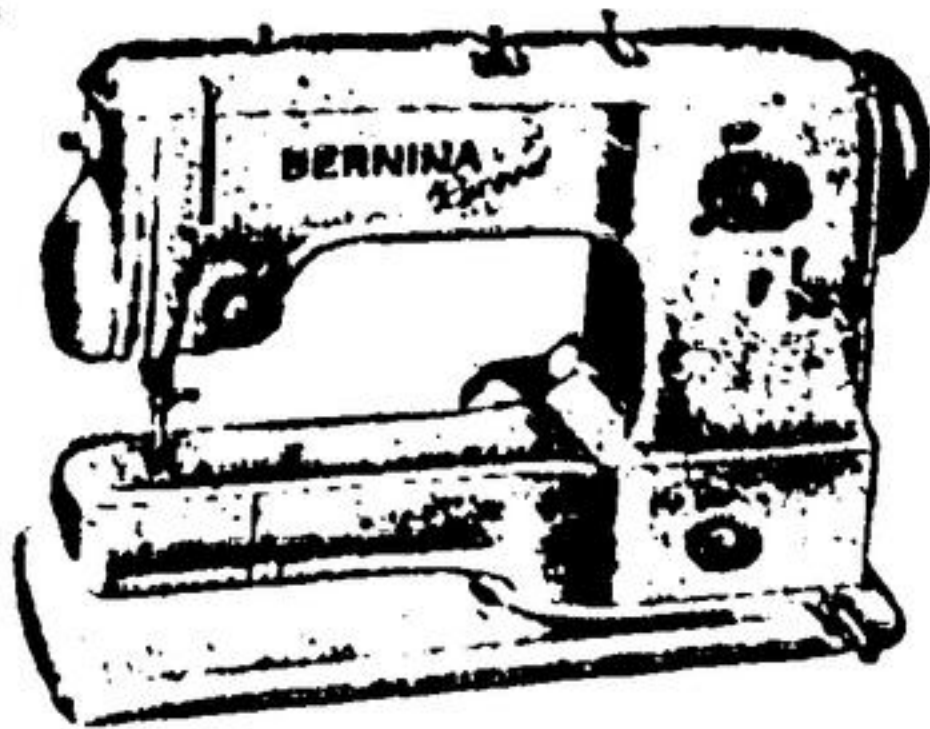

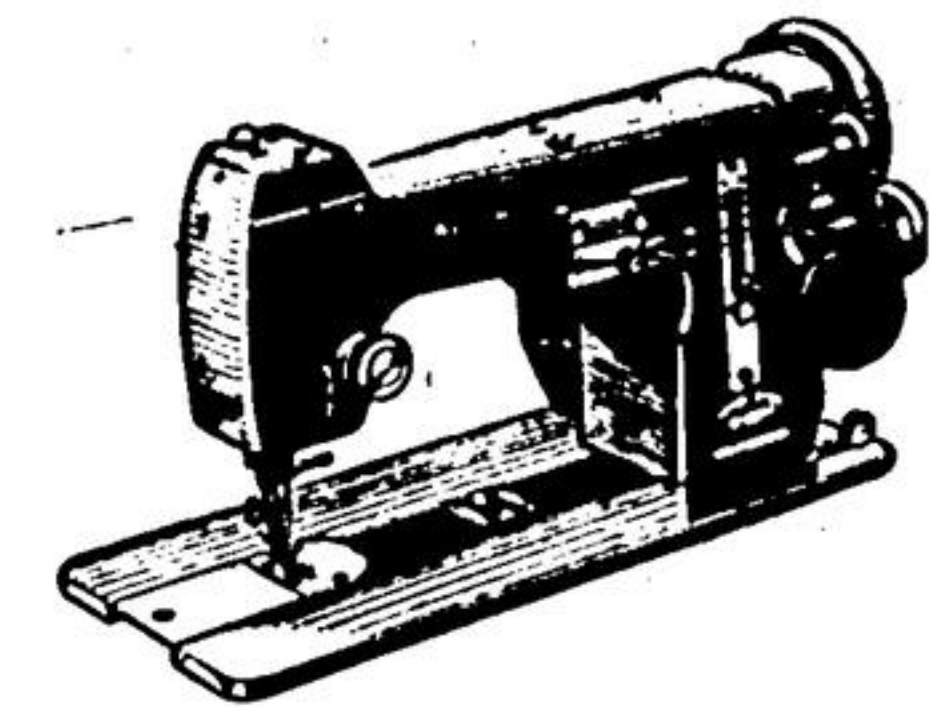

Plan North Pole In Halton County

Two men are building a fairy-land playground on a 100-acre site near Oakville.

The result of two year's work by William Adams of Aldershot and John Holz of Toronto will be open to the public next May. They will see all the fairy tale characters of the nursery books and the workshops of Santa Claus, complete with gnomes and reindeer.

"It has been patterned along the lines of similar playgrounds in the United States," says Mr. Adams.

It will contain about 20 buildings in all, depicting familiar scenes such as the cow jumping over the moon, the old woman's shoe, Old Mother Hubbard's cupboard and the gingerbread house.

Feature attraction will be Santa's home and workshops. An inter-denominational chapel with a nativity scene inside will be nearby.

To complete the picture, Mr. Adams said, plans are afoot to have a post office, known as North Pole, Canada, set up in the park.
