Reprinted from Junior Farmer News

Although he was born in New Jersey, George Atkins feels that the fact that his birthday was July 1st just automatically made him a Canadian. Evidently his parents thought so, too for, when he was very young, they moved to their farm "The Woodlands" near Bronte. Now operating his own farm and active in senior groups in the community, this former Junior is still very closely associated with Junior Farmer activities. So this month we are happy to introduce to Ontario Juniors George S. Atkins of Bronte, a former member of the Provincial Executive.

A graduate of the OAC, George did one year of post-graduate study at the University of Wisconsin before settling down on the home farm with his bride, the former Janet Blackwood of Guelph. George and Janet have four fine girls, Margaret, Mary, Norah and Louise, aged 9, 7, 5 and 4 respectively. The two older girls are eagerly looking forward to the time when they will be old enough to participate in 4-H and Junior Farmer work.

One of the main interests on the farm is the herd of pure-bred Holstein-Friesians, the milk from which is shipped to the Toronto market. In addition they grow registered seed grain and a variety of fruit including apples, pears, cherries and grapes. Recently they have been planting some acreage to Christmas trees.

Each year since 1938 they have carried on experiments and demonstrations including variety, fertilizer, mulching and cultivation tests in cooperation with the OAC, the Soil and Crop Improvement Association, and the University of Wisconsin. These tests have been in relation to various crops such as corn, oats, barley, hay and pasture. As a result George and his neighbours have been able to improve their farming methods.

George began his Junior Farmer career with the Palermo Club, Halton county, serving as vice president and later as president before moving up to the presidency of the county association in 1946-47. That same year he was elected Director to the Provincial Association and served on the Executive the following year.

Some of the Junior Farmer projects with which George was very closely associated were Public Speaking, Amateur Entertainment, the provincial constitution, the Junior Farmer film, radio broadcasts and the conservation brief. Since 1952 he has represented the Junior Farmers' Association as Junior Executive member of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture. For the last two or three years he has also been working on a new Junior Farmer handbook.

Although he has always been so closely connected with Junior work, he has found time to take part in other organizations, both local and county. He has been active in the Home and School, church young people's groups and laymen's associations, the Federation of Agriculture and the Soil and Crop Improvement Association.

Getting back to Junior Farmers, George comments that the tenth anniversary year of the Provincial Association has served to point up in the minds of those who had something to do with its early days, the wonderful accomplishments of the past decade. George is firmly convinced that the movement provides a wonderfully broadening experience for all young people who participate in it.

One of his dreams for the future concerns an accessible Junior Farmer campsite with permanent heated buildings, playing fields, swimming facilities, etc. This could be used the year round for Junior Farmer camps, and conferences, housing for the National 4-H Club competitors as well as provincial and regional 4-H Club camps.

He feels that such a campsite could also provide accommodation for many senior farm organizations for holding their annual conferences and meetings.

Another dream is that of a national Junior Farmer movement in Canada, which can, of course, only be accomplished when young farm people are organized in most other provinces.
