

**Hospital Equipment Fund
Now More Than \$1,000.00**

Now that Peel Memorial Hospital's Special Equipment Fund has passed the \$1,000 mark, the committee is more hopeful than ever that the \$2,500, total objective set for the end of campaign early in February, will be attained and exceeded.

To date 125 members have been enrolled in the Hospital Association and there is every indication that before the annual meeting in February, 250 or more town and district citizens will have joined the association by paying

the nominal membership fee of \$2.00 per person. As pointed out previously by Mr. R. L. Blain, the Hospital Board president, the aim of this campaign is two fold, to procure more members to share in the job of governing the hospital affairs and provide extra funds for the purchase of needed equipment for this rapidly expanding community institution.

come to realize their obligation and see fit to join the hospital association and lend a hand in its administration and financing.

**Trust Company Planned
For Peel and Halton**

A number of interested citizens in the two counties are making application to the Ontario Government for incorporation of a local trust company to be known as the Halton and Peel Trust and Savings Company, with the head office in Oakville.

According to Mr. A. S. Nicholson, lumberman, of Burlington, and chairman of the Provisional Board, and one of those interested in the project, the new company will have an authorized capital of \$2,000,000 of which over \$435,000 of shares have been subscribed by more than ninety local people. He said that the company would be under the management of O. E. Manning, Oakville, who for 17 years was general manager of the Grey and Bruce Trust and Savings Company, and has served as manager of the new business and advertising departments of the Canada Permanent Mortgage and Trust Companies. Mr. Manning is a former president of the Trust Companies Association of Ontario.

It is planned to give complete Trust Company services including savings, investment plans, mortgage loans, and act as executor and trustee under wills, trustees of employee pension funds, endowment funds and many other trustee capacities.

Mr. Nicholson further stated that, as soon as the charter is granted, a group of 12 to 15 Directors will be elected from among the shareholders to direct the company's affairs. In the meantime, the following are five members of the Provisional Board who carry on until the charter is granted and the regular Board of Directors elected.

Present members are: A. S. Nicholson, Burlington; Dr. C. A. Martin, of Milton; O. E. Manning, Oakville; Brigadier Jas. Roberts and Angus McMillan of Oakville.

It is planned to open branch offices in other sections of the two counties as business develops, and as mortgage loans and trust services are required in this fast developing area.

—First opportunity for the general public to view the new high school addition will be next Thursday when an Open Night is planned at the school. Parents will also be able to talk with the teachers that night about students' progress.
