

CF-100 Cutback will Lay Off 1000 at AVRO

Some 1,000 of the 10,000 employees at the A. V. Roe plant will be laid off at the end of this month because of a cutback in production of the CF-100 twin jet fighter.

The layoffs will not effect the 6,000 employees at Orenda Engines Ltd , an AVRO subsidiary in Malton.

The layoffs resulted from a federal government order to stretch out production of the jet fighters until about 1958, it is believed when new AVRO fighters are expected to be ready, for production The company is known to be working on a delta-wing jet expected to be twice as fast as the 600 mph CF-100.

A defence department spokesman said in Ottawa the cutback followed the normal pattern of decreasing production once a certain peak has been reached and the basic needs for the RCAF met




