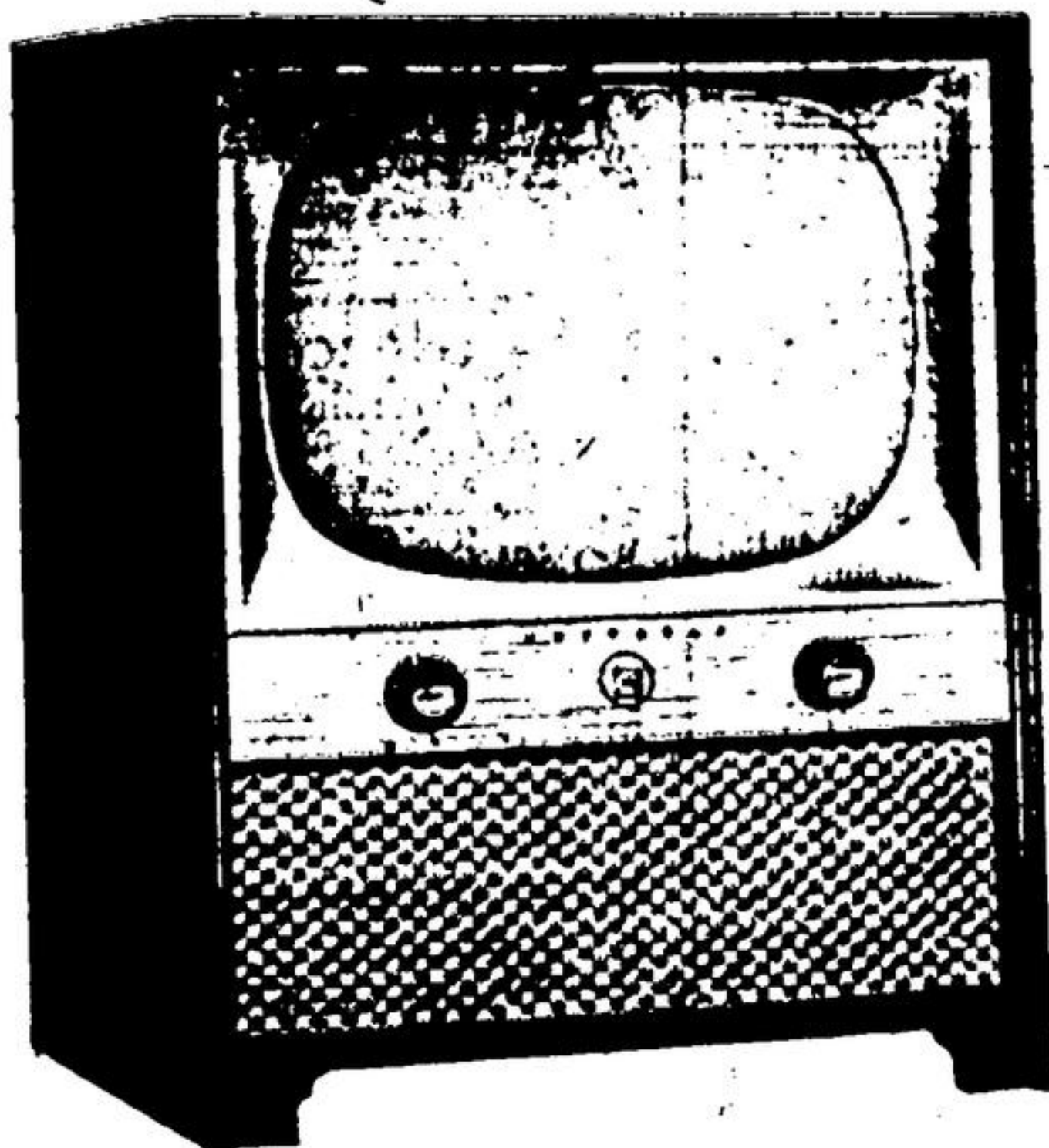

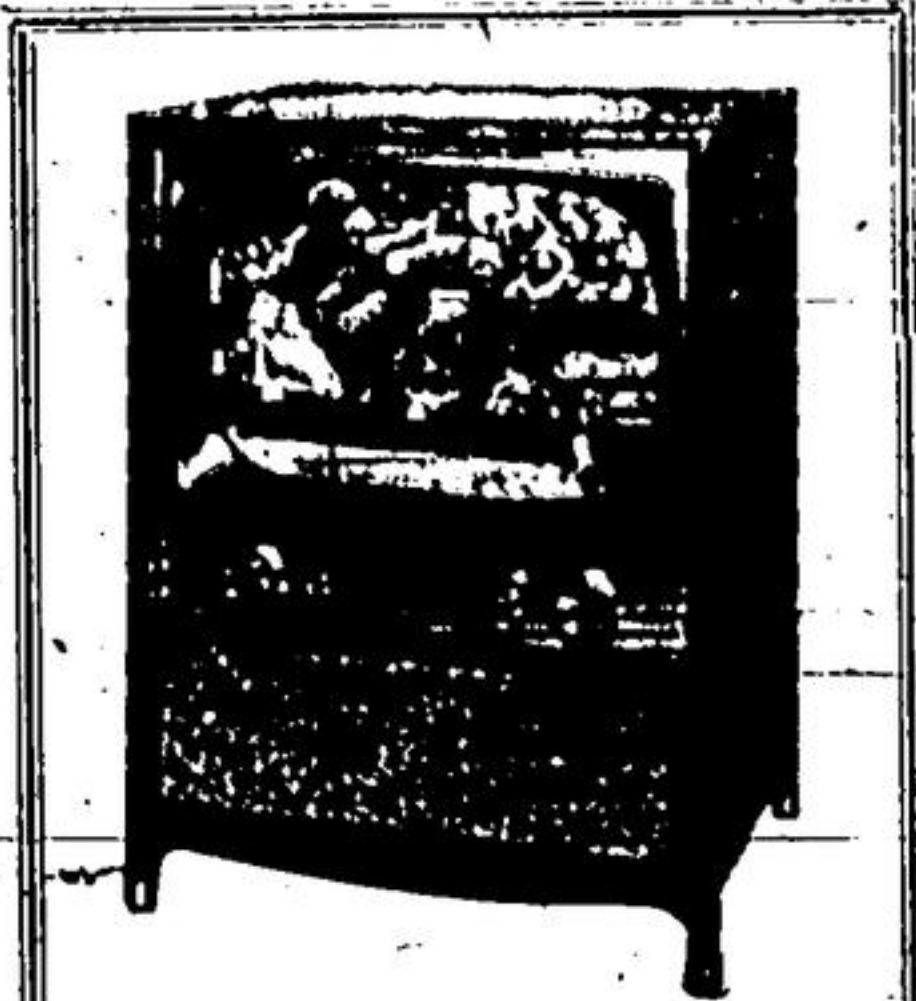

## Postmaster's Widow Lived Here 56 Years

Widow of a former Georgetown postmaster, Janetta Isabel Cobban McDermid was buried in Greenwood Cemetery following a funeral service Thursday at the McClure Funeral Home.

Mrs. McDermid, who had been in Peel Memorial Hospital, Brampton, since undergoing an operation on December 30th, died suddenly on Tuesday.

Prominent in ladies' groups of St. John's United Church, she had lived in Georgetown over fifty years, coming here as a bride from Acton. She was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Cobban of that town. She was a life member and past president of the Mission Society and also devoted much of her time to the work of the Women's Auxiliary. She was fond of golf and was a member of the old Cedarcrest Golf Club several years ago.

Her husband, who died in 1930, was postmaster here from 1913 until the time of his death, and before that conducted a family grocery business which was located in the present Garner store building. Their son John is minister of St. Paul's United Church, Brampton. An only daughter, Isabel, who died ten years ago is remembered as a member of the post office staff.

Mrs. McDermid also leaves one grandson, John, and two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Elliott, Edmonton, Alta., and Mrs. Clara Jackson, Calgary, Alta.

A brother, Mitchell Cobban died several years ago in Winnipeg. Rev. Morgan McFarlane conducted the funeral service and pallbearers were a nephew, W. C. Kennedy and John Squires, Toronto, Walter Richardson, Graham Farnell, Norm Burns and William Deans.

A copy of the Spanish-English bilingual New Testament was displayed, as well as a copy of the Japanese-English which is being placed in Japan, partly by Canadian Gideons support.

A similar service was held in the evening in First Baptist Church, Brampton. Mr. Roberts told both audiences of the memorial bible plan, whereby when a person dies, bibles along with flowers can be placed through local funeral directors as a lasting tribute to the memory of a Christian loved one. ## New Windows Major Church Improvements

Acquisition and payment in full of new church windows was a major work accomplished by the congregation of Norval Presbyterian Church during the past year.

The annual general meeting was held last Tuesday in the church basement, with an encouraging attendance of members including representatives of the various church organizations.

After dinner, served by the W.A., the meeting was opened with scripture and prayer by the Rev. G. Lockhart Royal. Nelson Robinson was elected chairman with Mrs. Hugh Clark as recording secretary.

Mr. Royal gave the session report. With addition of ten new members, the communion roll now stands at 141 active members. There were three deaths, Robert Reid, Miss Edith McClure and Mrs. Freeman Kersey, and seven baptisms during the year. Mr. Royal gave a warm appreciation of Mr. Reid's service to the church as an elder of forty years' standing.

The increased budget allocation of \$233 was explained by a general expansion of the missionary activities of the church and was accepted.

The Kirk session recommended that the Presbyterian Record be carried into all homes in the church and this was accepted by the meeting. It was pointed out that three elders would be elected by the end of February and that necessary arrangements for balloting would be made at the appropriate time. A mimeograph machine is being acquired for use of the Norval and Union churches.

Ronald Perry was thanked by the session for his generous gift to the church of the two lovely flags now displayed in church, the Union Jack and the Christian Church flag.

Mr. Royal thanked Oliver Hunter and the board for their energetic endeavours throughout the year. Nelson Robinson gave a brief résumé of the activities of the board of managers and Mr. Hunter a review of work undertaken and completed, the most gratifying single item being the new windows. Garfield McClure was requested to take charge of the church documents.

Reports were then submitted and approved treasurer's report by Mrs. Nelson Robinson, Mission Band, Mrs. Sam McClure, Sunday School, S. Hardie, who announced the appointment of Sam McClure as school secretary-treasurer. W.A. by Mrs. Percy Leslie.

The board of managers will stay at twelve, and it was moved that no retiring members be immediately re-elected. Four new members were appointed by ballot, Sidney Hardie, Percy Leslie, J. M. McClure and William Reid. Board members remaining in office are Oliver Hunter, Nelson Robinson, W. T. Craig Reid, Andrew McClure, Bruce Reid, James Davis, Chester Early and Donald Clark.

The music committee stands as follows: Mrs. Oliver Hunter, Betty McClure, Mrs. Harold McClure and Mrs. G. L. Royal. Mrs. Nels Robinson was re-elected treasurer and plate collectors and ushers were also re-elected with the addition of Bob Crawford, Jr. as checker. William Townsend was reappointed auditor.

It was proposed that Mr. Royal take the anniversary service and a proposal was also made that Sunday School meet at 1:30 and church at 2:30 in the future. Present members of the session are: Rev. G. L. Royal, Lester Brown, Craig McClure, Tom McGee, Arthur McClure, Malcolm McNabb, W. J. McClure and Albert Hunter.

The bibles are placed in hotels, schools, hospitals, motels, reform institutions, fire halls, offices of doctors and dentists and many other places.

Saturday night a banquet was held at St. John's, with the church ladies catering. After a singsong, the Gideons were addressed by Mr. Roberts. Guests included the minister, Rev. Morgan McFarlane, and out-of-town Gideons and their wives.
