**Add More Equipment
At Brampton Hospital**

With a view to further improving the efficiency and service at Peel Memorial Hospital, the Board of Governors at its January meeting last Thursday, accepted the recommendation of its administrator, and authorized the purchase of two new pieces of equipment.

The Obstetrical Department is to receive a much needed modern Obstetrical Delivery Table costing \$1500. A third oxygen tent, costing \$625, will also be added to the general equipment in order to cope with the ever increasing need for such service at the Hospital.

In addition to these two items costing \$2125, the Board recently authorized the expenditure of \$1300 to equip the new Physio-therapy Department.

These purchases are made possible by the Equipment Fund Donations totalling over \$1800 to date, and which it is hoped will go well over \$2000 before the campaign closes on February 22nd, the date of the Annual meeting.

The Capital Funds of the Hospital were further enhanced by two bequests announced at Thursday's Board meeting.

Mrs. Rose Jane Fynwick bequeathed Peel Memorial the sum of \$5,000 and the Leslie Ina Sanderson bequest was for \$100.

Such bequests are greatly appreciated by the Board and go a long way in the financing of necessary capital outlays at the Hospital.

Frank W. Chisholm, Dairy Herd Improvement Supervisor, reports that in one of his herds, that of Cliff Wrigglesworth, of Hornby, there is a grade daughter of Lunelm Texas Anthony. In her first three lactations on 305 day, two times milking, she has produced a total of 37,927 pounds of milk and 1302 lbs. of butter fat. The records in question were as follows:

2 year old, 11,330 lbs. milk, 384 lbs. B.F., 3 year old, 12,048 lbs. milk, 400 lbs. B.F., 4 year old, 14,540 lbs. milk, 509 lbs. B.F.

She is now in as a five year old, and to date has given birth to seven calves, two bulls and five heifers. Frank further reports that this Anthony daughter tapes slightly over 1500 lbs.

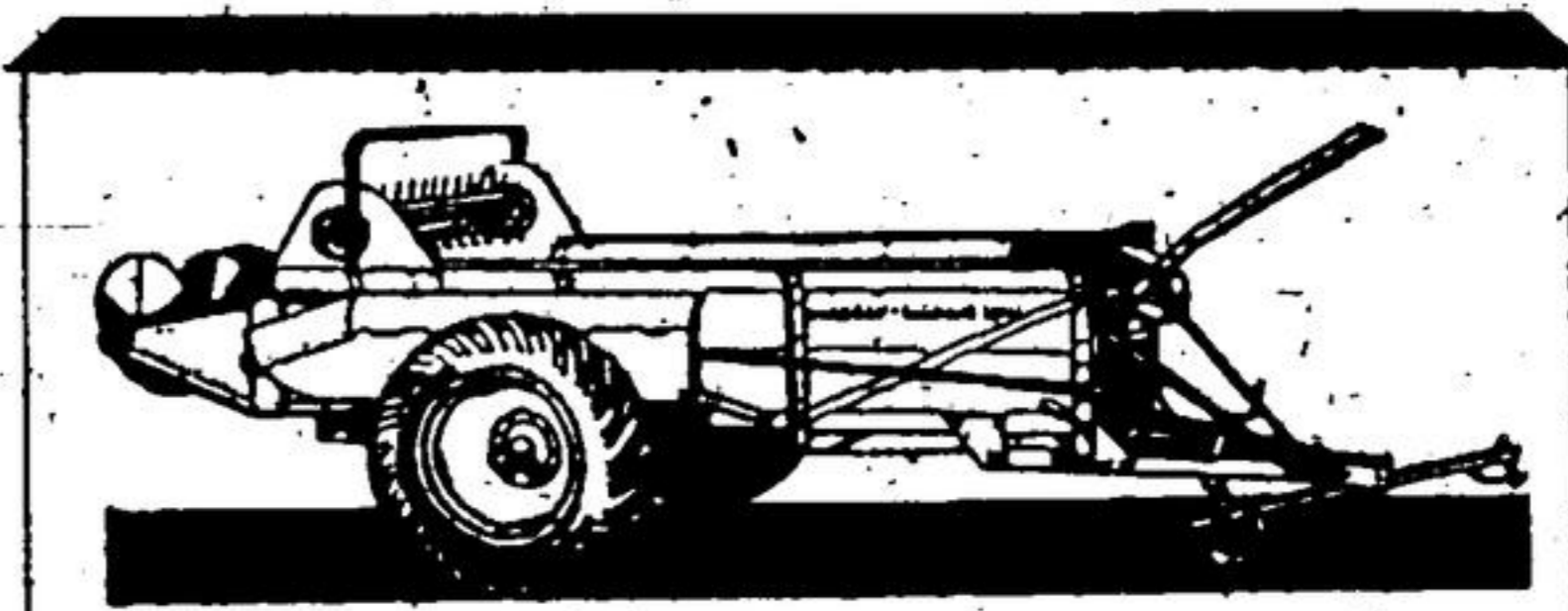
