Deny Munro Request for Free Subdivision Services

With legal opinion that council was in a position to decide either way on charging for water and sewer services into a projected housing subdivision, council at a meeting last Thursday decided to make no exception in the case of contractor Finlay Munro who, at a meeting earlier in the week, appealed for consideration.

Mr. Munro, who is owner of an 84 lot property purchased from Tom Hewson, reminded council that in 1953, when the subdivision was first planned, council had agreed to put in free services. '.

The town has petitioned county council to take over the unfinished part of Maple Avenue as a county connecting link

There is some possibility that this road will be completed this year, linking the east and west Maple roadways, and providing a second traffic artery between the east and west parts of town. - -

Cr Doug Sargent mentioned a proposal to make a start on clearing up surveying difficulties in town, by establishing fixed points from which surveys can be made. His suggestion is that concrete posts be placed at fixed locations from time to time, so that eventually any point in town can be determined in its relation to these survey centres.

Mr Sargent's idea is to establish ten of these 'monuments" this year. Cost is estimated at \$1200, and the Ontario government will pay half the cost.




