**NORVAL**  
**CONTINUE PROGRAM OF CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS**

The annual vestry meeting of St. Paul's Church, Norval, was held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Barnett, January 24th.

Following the signing of the Vestry register, the meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. J. E. Maxwell. Mrs. Cameron Parker was appointed vestry clerk.

The rector in his report to the Vestry pointed out that this had been a year of advance for St. Paul's during which the interior of the church had been completely redecorated, a new ceiling installed, and the completion of the new basement under way.

The treasurer's report was read by Miss Prairie Maguire and showed a substantial balance on hand. Mrs. Harold Gollop read the Financial Report of the Guild which revealed a very successful year.

It was decided to complete the basement hall as soon as possible so that it might be used for Sunday School purposes. It was pointed out that repairs to the furnace are badly needed, and that the hall should be wired for hydro and a new ceiling installed. Business relating to the purchase of a new organ and choir vestments was discussed. It was agreed that the publishing of a weekly bulletin would be of value to the congregation and the rector pointed out that the present machinery in the Rectory was adequate for printing such a bulletin and had been made available to another church in the village for this very purpose over the past several years.

The following officers were appointed: Arthur Barnett, rector's warden, John Rawlins, People's Warden, Miss Prairie Maguire, Treasurer, Alan Taylor, Lay Delegate and Sunday School superintendent; Walter Fidler, substitute Lay Delegate; John Rawlins, president of the choir; Sidemen, Walter Woolston, Harry Perkins, Alan Taylor, Warwick Coup land, Ormie Carter, Gordon Fricker, Harold Smellie, William Finamore, Arthur Burton.

The rector thanked the wardens and members of the congregation for their cooperation and assistance during the past year. Votes of thanks were passed to the following: Mr. C. A. Grant, Hewson and Glancy, Baristers, Mr. Harold C. McClure, for their help in various activities of the Church. It was moved that a letter of welcome to this community be sent to the Rev. and Mrs. A. R. Muir, of the United Church.

The rector read a letter from the Bishop, Rt. Rev. W. E. Bagnall, congratulating the congregation on their contribution toward the missionary work of the church.

Mrs. H. Gollop and Mrs. O. Carter were appointed auditors for the ensuing year.

The meeting adjourned with prayer following which refreshments were served.

Miss Maguire expressed the thanks of all present to Mr. and Mrs. Barnett for the use of their home.

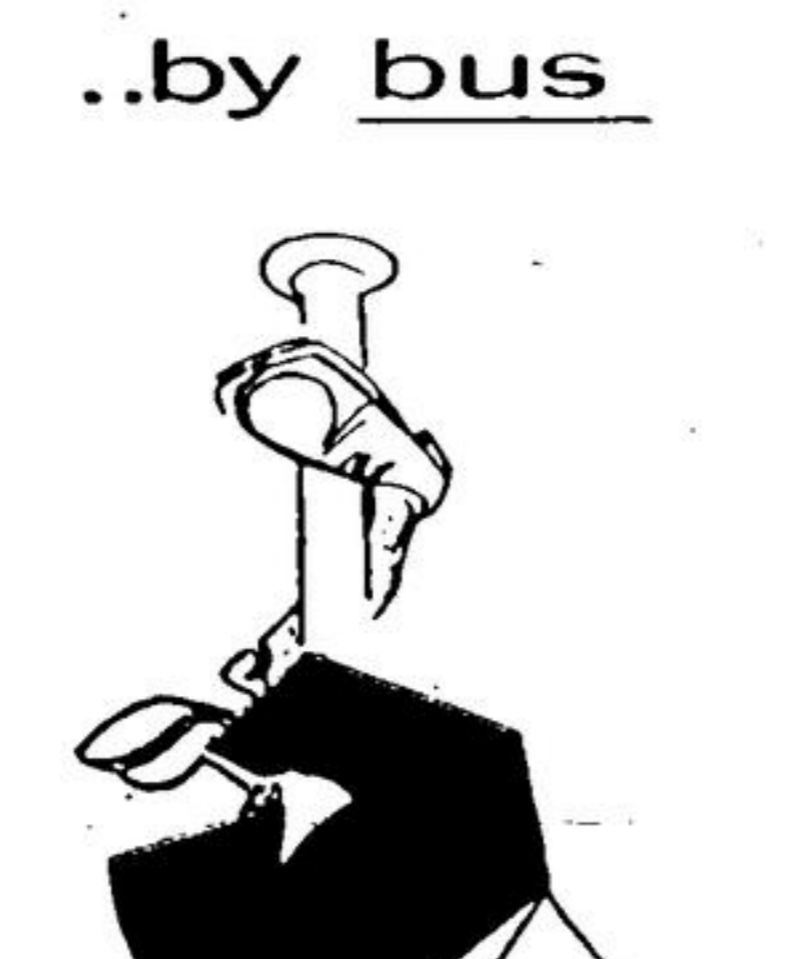
