**Another New Teacher For Growing Public School Enrolment**

Increasing enrolment in the two public schools has led to engaging another full-time teacher at Wrigglesworth school, and the probability that another teacher will have to be added at Chapel Street school before the end of this term.

Last week Mrs. Ann Gwizdala joined the Wrigglesworth staff, to teach a combined Grade 5 and 7 class which is used in the new addition. The 4-room addition, completed in December, is now completely filled, while Chapel Street is also taxed to capacity for accommodation. Coming of Mrs. Gwizdala to the school makes four new teachers engaged this school year, two in September and two in January. Ten teachers are now employed at each school.

Statistics this week show present enrolment at Wrigglesworth of 345 (there were 322 in September). There are 302 at Chapel Street compared with 304 in September. Principals Harold Henry and William Kinrade report that there is scarcely a Monday that does not see at least one new pupil arriving. At Chapel St. for instance, there have been 15 new students since the first of the year. Mrs. Gwizdala, who comes from London, England, is a graduate of Salisbury Training School, taught two years in England and part-time in Aurora last year. She and her husband moved here last fall and are living on Henry Street in the Cloverdale Heights subdivision.
