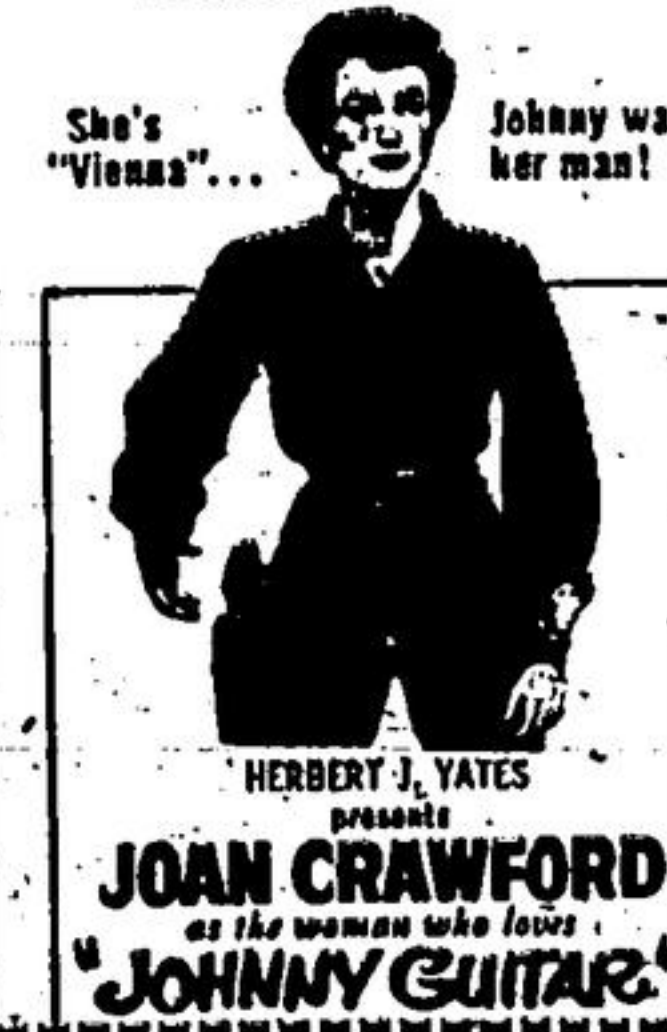

### KEN ELLA HERD TOPS IN JERSEYS

In recent year the Rock-Ella herd of Kenneth Ella & Sons has been forging ahead very rapidly, and now it has one of the highest average milk productions of any constructive breeder herd in Canada, figured on a mature, equivalent basis - The average production of the well-known herd on 16 cows is 10,766 lbs. of milk and 590 lbs. of fat. The 18 classified cows have the high average rating of 85.28 percent.

In developing this high production herd of splendid type the Ellas had considerable help from their former herd sire Lindale Aldna Lad, a silver medal bull that has recently qualified as a superior sire with 10 tested daughters that average 10,880 lbs. of milk and 543 lbs. of fat with a test of 5 percent, (A great compliment both to his breeder and to his owner). His 11 classified daughters average 85.25 percent (the highest average milk production rating of any superior sire so far qualified in Canada).

Now all this success means hard and thorough work. Kenneth is a hard worker himself, and Mrs. Ella has put her whole heart and soul, and her energy into that great herd, and all their work has carried them to heights very seldom reached by Live Stock Breeders.

### Was Glen Bandman Many Years Ago

#### Honour Certificates Awarded Ella Jerseys

A pleasing feature of the program at the annual meeting of the Ontario Jersey Club was the presentation of "Roll of Honour" Certificates to three animals in the herd of Mr. and Mrs. Ken Ella of Hornby. Rock-Ella Sporting Diane, which animal was a class leader in 1953, duplicated her achievement by again leading the junior 3 year old class in the 305 day on two times milking for both milk and butter fat. Her record for 1954 is 11,200 lbs. of milk and 611 lbs. of butterfat. She is a daughter of the Superior sire, Lindale Aldna Lad.

A suchid animal in this same herd to receive a "Roll of Honour" certificate as the class leader for butter fat in the Junior 4 year old class in 305 days on two times milking, was Rock-Ella Star Lily. Her production was 11,205 lbs. of milk and 635 lbs. B.F.

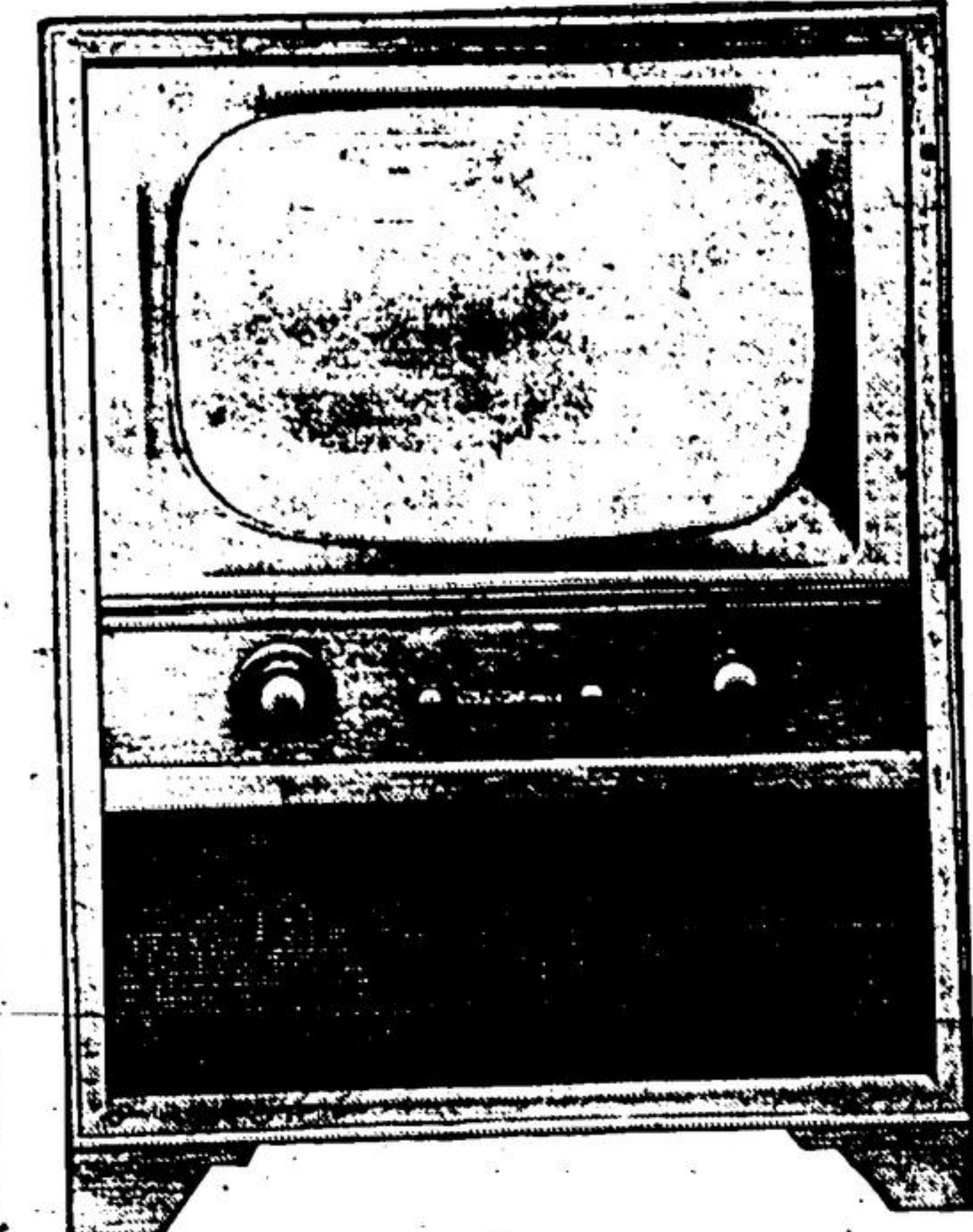
