

**Lash, Wright, Get
Railway Promotions**

Donald Gordon, chairman and president of the Canadian National Railways, recently announced the appointments of George Herbert Lash as assistant to president, and of William Richard Wright as director of public relations. The appointments became effective Nov. 1st.



A former newspaper man, Herb Lash brings to his new post a wide and intimate knowledge of Canadian affairs. Born in St. John's, Nfld. in 1894, he interrupted a journalistic career in Toronto, to serve overseas in 1915. In World War II, Mr. Lash served in Ottawa as executive assistant to the censorship co-ordinating committee, and in 1940 became Director of Public Information for Canada to organize and develop this branch of the country's war effort. He handled press arrangements for the Royal Tour early in 1930.

Mr. Wright was born in Montreal in 1919, and educated at Selwyn House School, Westmount High



School and McGill University. He studied law for two years at McGill where he won the graduates' prize for highest standing in his first year and a university scholarship.

After a distinguished naval career, Mr. Wright was appointed private secretary to the Minister of National Defence in 1947. During his service with National Defence, he was closely associated with the public relations activities of the department. He joined the Canadian National Railways early this year as special assistant in the office of the president.

He is a member of the Rideau Club of Ottawa, Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club, Naval Officers Club of Montreal, Sir Arthur Currie branch of the Canadian Legion, and the McGill Graduates Society.

**LINDALE JERSEYS
HIGH FOR CANADA**

For the second time Maurice C. Beatty, Lindale Jersey Farm, Milton, Ontario, has qualified as a constructive breeder.

Every cow in the herd except 2 are homebred, and the thirty-two cows average 8,979 lbs. of milk, and 510 lbs. of fat — with an average test

of 5.68 percent. Several two year heifers are on test. There are 36 classified animals and they have the very high average of 87.36, the highest rated constructive breeder in Canada.

During the past years Mr. Beatty has had his former senior-herd sire Lindale Beacon Bull as a tested sire, and is the breeder of the silver medal and Superior are Lindale Aida Lad with the highest milk production rating of all superior sires in Canada — 10,860 lbs. of milk on his first ten tested daughters.

The Lindale herd created a wonderful impression on the World Jersey Bureau delegates when they visited Halton County in July. In fact all farm herds were highly praised.

Inhaling Immunity



A new method of inoculating fowl against Newcastle disease invites the attention of a King, His Majesty King Phumipol Aduldej of Thailand (right) watches as the vaccine is given intranasally. The vaccine was developed from a virus brought to Thailand by Dr. John Lancaster (second from right), a U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization expert from the United Kingdom. The new method has made possible successful mass field tests in an effort to wipe out the disease which is a scourge of the country's poultry industry. The cooperation of Thai farmers, who grow very fond of their barn animals, was gained when the painless inoculation was introduced.
