Hunting Parties Damage Farms, Council Says

Acting on requests from farm taxpayers who claim crops have been trampled and fences damaged by large hunting parties who travel in "drives" Esqueping Township council contacted the Dept. of Lands and Forests last month to see what action could be taken to deal with the situation. The department sent Mr. Marritt, district forester, located at Hespeler, to the council meeting on February 7th to discuss the matter. He told them that it is within the council's power to reduce the number of hunting licences issued far below the 700 which were issued in 1954. Council also asked a closer check on hunters by game wardens to ensure that those hunting carry the proper licences.

Bounty of \$3 each was paid on a total of 89 foxes shot in January by hunters. Dan Thompson, Milton, had the record bag of 14, Murray May had 13 and Wm Sheppard, Acton 11 and Harold DeForest 12.

Herbert started with the band when he was in public school and has served continuously since, except for five

years when he was on active service with the Canadian navy. His father, Sgt. Arthur Herbert, is the oldest member, in years of service, with the band and his uncle Thomas Herbert has also been a band stalwart for years.

Mr. Herbert, who is a master mechanic at Provincial Paper, Ltd., had a unique record in the navy of serving for 42 months continuously on the water. At war's end he was the only member of the crew of HMCS Battleford still with the ship since it had been commissioned.
