**Mill Office Manager
Was Prominent
School Trustee**

Prominent in school affairs in town and township, John Harris Bingham, 75, was buried in Greenwood Cemetery on Thursday, following funeral service at the McClure Funeral Home. He died on Tuesday at his home near town.

Mr. Bingham, who had been seriously ill since December, served as a rural school trustee for over thirty years. He was a member of the board of School Section 11, Glen Williams and when the school joined Esqueping Area No. 1 in 1946, he was elected an area trustee. At the time of his death he had been chairman of the board for several years. He also served several terms as a member of Georgetown High School board before it became part of the larger North Halton district.

Mr. Bingham began his business career with the CNR Express in 1908 when Georgetown Coated Paper Mills was incorporated, he became office manager. He held this position after the company was amalgamated with Alliance Paper Mills, Ltd., retiring in 1948.

At one time or another he was identified with almost every public service organization in town, and his executive ability was valued by the Red Cross, Victory Loan and similar groups. He was auditor for Esqueping Agricultural Society.

An Esqueping native, he was the son of John and Catherine Cranston Bingham, Irish immigrants, who were among the earlier settlers in Esqueping. He was born when they farmed on the 8th Line, and later lived at Centreville on the present James H. all farm, then at Lot 19, concession 10.

Unmarried, Mr. Bingham leaves a brother Harold and four sisters, Mrs. R. C. Given (Luth), Eliza J. Isabella and Rebecca.

The funeral service was conducted by Mr. John Stone, with Mr. Robert Resch assisting at the graveside. Pallbearers were J. D. Godfrey, L. E. Skuce, Ray Crichton, John Simpson, Ed Looker and Darwin Cripps. Friends attended the service from Barrie, Belleville, Brampton, Dunnville, Brantford, Hanover, Hamilton, Kit cheener, Toronto and Shelburne.
