

### Safety Awards for Brewer Truck Drivers

A Georgetown man, Jack Crawford, Jr. was one of several drivers employed by Brewers Warehousing Co. Ltd., who received safety awards at a gathering of company officials and employees at the Royal Hotel, Guelph on February 21st. Nineteen communities were represented.

Mr. Crawford and six other "accident-free" drivers received their Ontario Safety League medals and company cheques. Guest speaker was H. R. Thomson, company director of services, who outlined the development of the safety program within the company.

Other guests included Mayor Harry Worton, Chief of Police A. E. Lamb, Traffic Inspector Whitstone, R. E. Hamill, all of the city of Guelph, Sergeant H. S. Gaff of the Guelph detachment of the Provincial Police, Inspector Frank Scott, Sergeant McGillivray of the Mount Forest detachment of the Provincial Police, Mr. A. W. Sandrock Past President of Ontario Motor League of Kitchener.

Chairman of the meeting was Mr. G. G. Miller and Mr. H. L. O'Neill, Kitchener, who is in charge of the safety education made the arrangements for the meeting assisted by Mr. C. O. Scherer, Kitchener, and Mr. Willard Hayne, the company's manager at Guelph.

That motorists can be educated to pile up miles of accident-free driving is being proven by the Brewers Warehousing Co. Ltd. Company District Supervisors, who are graduates of the University of Toronto's Public Safety Division's Course for Fleet Operators, direct regular safety meetings and constant preventive maintenance inspections are made of company vehicles to ensure safe driving.
