Missionary for India Tells of Work There

Last Sunday was Missions Sunday at Pirst Baptist Church, with Rev. Orwille M. Getty, missionary on furlough from India as guest preacher. Rev. A. J. Barker conducted the services of worship. The choir anthems were: "Let the Song Go Round the Earth" and "Win the World for Christ."

At morning worship Mr. Getty chose as his text John 12:32 "And if I be lifted up from the earth; will draw all men unto me," relating how that promise of our Lord is being fulfilled in India today. In the evening he answered the question "Is our work in India Finished" by explaining at present there is a greater opportunity than ever before for new re-

cruits to spread the Gospel message. On the one hand among the more primitive people of the hill country many thousands of whom have never heard the Christian message, and on the other hand among the caste people and the intelligentia. At least 80 per cent of these have nothing to do when they leave college and thus turn to jobs offered by the Commun-.

Following the evening service a friendly hour sponsored by the Mission Circle was held in the Sunday School when the congregation had the opportunity to question and meet Mr. Getty in a more informal way, and also view the many curios and souv: enirs from India. Light refreshments served by the ladies concluded this time of fellowship.
