

**Missionary for India
Tells of Work There**

Last Sunday was Missions Sunday at First Baptist Church, with Rev. Orville M. Getty, missionary on furlough from India as guest preacher. Rev. A. J. Barker conducted the services of worship. The choir anthems were: "Let the Song Go Round the Earth" and "Win the World for Christ."
At morning worship Mr. Getty chose as his text John 12:32: "And if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me," relating how that promise of our Lord is being fulfilled in India today. In the evening he answered the question "Is our work in India finished?" by explaining at present there is a greater opportunity than ever before for new re-

cruits to spread the Gospel message. On the one hand among the more primitive people of the hill country many thousands of whom have never heard the Christian message, and on the other hand among the caste people and the intelligentsia. At least 80 per cent of these have nothing to do when they leave college and thus turn to jobs offered by the Communists.
Following the evening service a friendly hour sponsored by the Mission Circle was held in the Sunday School when the congregation had the opportunity to question and meet Mr. Getty in a more informal way, and also view the many curios and souvenirs from India. Light refreshments served by the ladies concluded this time of fellowship.

Outstanding courage shown by two men who risked their lives in the ice-filled Mimico creek last week saved the life of New Canadian Luyt Moesker, 26, of Hornby.
Moesker's light pickup truck slid off Highway 27 near Dixon Road, plunged down a bank and into the deep and icy river. The truck disappeared below the water.
Driving right behind Moesker was his neighbour Carel Duyt, 29. The two men, who live in apartments in the former Jim Bailey house in Hornby, had been delivering furniture in Rexdale and were on their way back to Cooksville.

Moesker's screams brought Duyt in Canada four months, into the water. How he battled his way through the tightly packed floes amazed police. He had reached his friend but was in difficulty when another passer-by came to aid him.
Red Mason, of Toronto, called to other drivers who had stopped and got a length of rope. With this tied around his waist he was able to reach the other two. All three were pulled ashore by those left on the bank.
Duyt and Moesker were treated at St. Joseph's Hospital for shock and exposure.
